## Safety and Use .....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained in this manual.

### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given studies, which show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area.
- check with your dealer or car manufacturer to make sure that the car electronics is well insulated.

### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

Always treat the phone with care and in a clean and dust-free place.

Switch off the phone before boarding an aircraft to avoid prosecution.

Switch off the phone when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile phones can interfere with the operation of other electric, electronic or radio frequency devices in their vicinity.

When the telephone is on, it should not come closer than 15cm to any medical device (i.e. cardiac pacemaker, hearing aid, insulin pump, etc.). When making or receiving a call, make sure you place the phone against the ear that is furthest away from the pacemaker or the hearing aid (if there is only one).

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey the rules relating to the use of mobile phones at fuel depots, petrol stations, chemical plants or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

Do not allow children to use your mobile phone without supervision.

Do not open or attempt to repair your mobile phone yourself.

Move the handset away from your ear while using the "handsfree" option because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Only use your telephone with Alcatel batteries, chargers and accessories compatible with your model (see page 90). The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage caused by the use of other chargers or batteries. Do not allow your mobile phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (dampness, rain, infiltration, dust, sea air, etc.). The minimum and maximum temperatures recommended by the manufacturer are between -10°C and +55°C. Beyond 55°C, the legibility of the display may be impaired, but this is temporary and not serious.

### • PRIVACY:

Please note that you must respect the laws and regulations in force in your country regarding taking photographs and recording sounds using your mobile telephone. Pursuant to such laws and regulations, it may be strictly forbidden to take photographs and/or to record the voices of other people or any of their personal attributes, and reproduce or distribute them, as this may be considered to be an invasion of privacy. It is the user's sole responsibility to ensure that prior authorisation be obtained, if necessary, in order to record private or confidential conversations or take a photograph of another person; the manufacturer, the seller or reseller of your mobile phone (including the operator) disclaim any liability which may result from the improper use of the mobile phone.

### • BATTERY:

Before removing the battery from your phone, please make sure that the phone is switched off. Observe the following precautions for battery use: do not attempt to open the battery (due to the risk of toxic fumes and burns), do not puncture, disassemble or cause a short-circuit, do not burn batteries or dispose of them in household rubbish, and do not expose to temperatures in excess of 60°C. Batteries must be disposed of in accordance with locally applicable environmental regulations. Only use the battery for the purpose for which it was designed. Never use damaged batteries or not recommended by Alcatel.

### • CHARGERS


Mains powered chargers will operate within the temperature range: 0°C to 40°C.

The chargers designed for your mobile phone meet with the standard for safety of information technology equipment and office equipment use. They should be used for this purpose only.

### • RADIO WAVES:

Proof of compliance with international standards (ICNIRP) or with European Directive 1999/5/EC (R&TTE) is required of all mobile phone models before they can be put on the market. The protection of the health and safety for the user and any other person is an essential requirement of these standards or this directive.

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter/receiver. It was designed and manufactured to comply with the radiofrequency (RF) exposure thresholds recommended by international requirements (ICNIRP) <sup>(1)</sup> and by the Council of the European Union (Recommendation 1999/519/EC) <sup>(2)</sup>. These limits are part of a set of requirements and establish authorised radiofrequency levels for the public. These limits were established by groups of independent experts on the basis of regular and detailed scientific assessments. They include a significant safety margin intended to ensure the safety of all, regardless of age or state of health.

The exposure standard for mobile phones is determined by a measurement unit known as the Specific Absorption Rate or "SAR". The SAR limit is set by international requirements or by the Council of the European Union at 2 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over ten grams of body tissue. The tests used to determine SAR levels were carried out on the basis of standard usage modes with the phones transmitting at their maximum power level over the entire range of frequency bands. Although the SAR was established at the highest certified level, the actual SAR level for the mobile phone during use is generally much lower than the maximum values. In fact, since mobile phones are designed to operate at many different power levels, they only use the minimum level of power required to provide a connection to the network. In theory, the closer you are to a base station antenna, the lower the power level required by the mobile phone.


The highest tested SAR value for this mobile phone for use at the ear and compliance against the standard is 0.43 W/kg. While there may be differences between the SAR levels on various mobile phones and at various positions, they all meet the relevant International guidelines and EU requirements for RF exposure.

Your telephone is equipped with a built-in antenna. For optimal operation, you should avoid touching it or degrading it (see page 14).

The World Health Organisation (WHO) considers that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for use of mobile phones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using "hands-free" devices to keep mobile phones away from the head and body. 
### Protection against theft

Your mobile phone has an identification number called IMEI (phone serial number) shown on the packaging label and in the product's memory. We recommend that you note this number the first time you use your telephone by entering , , , , and keep it safely. It may be requested by the police or Vodafone if your telephone is stolen. This number allows your mobile telephone to be blocked, preventing a third person from using it, even with a different SIM card.



## 2 Getting started .....

### 2.1 Set-up


#### Inserting and removing your Vodafone SIM card <sup>(1)</sup>

You must insert your SIM card in order to use your phone.




Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted.

#### Installing and removing the battery




Insert and engage the battery, then close the telephone cover.



Unclip the cover, then the battery and remove it.

<sup>(1)</sup> Check with Vodafone to make sure that your SIM card is 3V compatible. The old 5 Volt cards can no longer be used.

#### Charging the battery




Connect the battery charger



The charge is complete when the animation stops. Only use ALCATEL chargers.


#### Precautions during use




Do not place you hand on the upper part of the mobile phone.

## 2.2 Switching on your telephone

Make a long keypress on the key until the telephone comes on, type in your PIN code if necessary and then confirm with the key. The main screen is displayed.

If you don't know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact Vodafone. Do not leave your PIN code near your telephone.

If cell broadcast messages are displayed, use the key to browse through them in full or press the key to return to the main screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, the <<<->>> symbol is displayed (???-??? is displayed if your SIM card is rejected by the network, in this case please contact Vodafone).

In the switch on screen, you also have access to a video clip demo function: select the left icon with the navigation key . Even if no SIM card inside, you will have access to the video clips list.

## 2.3 Switching off your telephone

Press the key from the main screen (long keypress).

# 3 Calls .....

## 3.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the key to place the call. To hang up, press the key. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the key.

To enter characters “+” or “P” (pause), make a long keypress on the key (the following characters will scroll by: 0, +, P, •).

### Making an emergency call

If your phone is in network coverage, dial **112** and press the key to make an emergency call (or any other number provided by Vodafone). This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code or unblocking the keypad.

### Making a call with a prefix

To access the various prefixes, make a long keypress on , stop at “+” sign and use the key.

- To make an international call, go to , select the country, finish dialling the number and send the call.
- If you already know the prefix you want, go directly to the icon and enter the prefix directly followed by the number of the person you are calling.
- In some companies, telephone numbers all begin with the same digits. By using the “**Prefix**” feature , you can save the shared digits, but you will need to enter the variable part. You must create the prefixes yourself.

### Phone auto-redial

If this feature is activated and supported by the network (see page 79), the person you called will be called back automatically until they can be reached.

### 3.2 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by Vodafone to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine and you can consult it at any time. To access your voicemail, make a long keypress on the  key.

If the access number for your voicemail service does not work, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to “**My Numbers**” (see page 27).

 To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact Vodafone before leaving.

### 3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the  key to talk and then hang up using the  key.

When you have an incoming call, your telephone rings quietly at first and then gets louder. If the  icon is displayed, the vibrator is activated and there is no ringtone. If the  icon is displayed, the phone neither rings nor vibrates.

 The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact Vodafone to check service availability).

### Muting the ringtone

Press the  key once while the telephone is ringing. Answer the call by pressing the  key, or select “Options”.

### Rejecting a call

Press the  key once or the  key twice, or select “Options”.

### 3.4 During the call

#### Available functions

During a call, you can use your contact list, short messages, etc. without losing your correspondent by pressing the  key.

#### Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the sound level during a call using the navigation key  or the side keys.

### Handling two calls

- **Call waiting** <sup>(1)</sup>  
 If a second call comes in while you are already on line, you will be notified by a tone. You can then accept the call by pressing the  key.  
 Your current call will be automatically put on hold. You can then switch between your two correspondents using the  key and then .
- **Making a second call**  
 To call a second party during a call, dial the number directly.

### 3.5 Conference calls <sup>(1)</sup>

Your phone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to 5). If you are on a double call, press , select “**Conference**” then confirm with the  key. If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing the  key and speak with your new correspondent.

This correspondent becomes a member of the conference if you press , select “**Add conf.**”, and then confirm by pressing . Pressing  disconnects the current call.

To end the conference call, press  and select “**End conf.**”.

## 5 Contacts.....

### 5.1 Contact list

You can customize a quick access to your contacts with the “**Speed dial list**” function (see page 27).

To access the contact list from your main screen, press the  key, select “**Contacts**” with the  navigation key, press  again and select “**Contact list**”.

You have 4 contact lists:



**SIM directory:**

The SIM card's capacity depends on the type of SIM you have. It is not possible to assign more than one number to a name.



**General list:**

Contains all contacts saved on the phone. The SIM card contacts are not created automatically in the general list, but they can be copied to it.



**Personal list:**

You can store your personal contacts in this list (relatives, friends, etc.).



**Professional list:**

You can store your professional contacts in this list (companies, etc.).

In addition to the lists already provided, you can create your own lists (see page 25).

#### Searching for a name by its first letter

You can search for the person's name by pressing the key associated with the first letter of his/her name.



For some languages that have a specific entry mode, you should use the “**Search name**” option.

### Read a contact file

Select a name from your contact list and confirm with the  key. Select “**View**” and confirm.

### Making the call

Press the  key when the name is selected. If several numbers are associated with the name to be called, you must then choose the number from the list (Mobile, Home, Office, etc.) using the  key. Press the  key to make the call.

 Information in the contact list and the calendar may be shared with a computer using the Alcatel One Touch PC suite (see page 86).

## 5.2 Creating a contact file

Select the contact list in which you wish to create a file, press the right softkey, select “**Create contact**” then . You can save the data you have entered at any time by pressing the left softkey “**Save**”. Go to the following field by pressing the  key or by using the navigation key .

When you create a new contact in the phone list, at least one of the following fields must be filled in:  Identity card,  Birthday,  Nickname,  URL,  Numbers,  Image,  E-mail,  Address,  Notes,  Pers. info. 1...4.

You can move from one field to another using the  key.

When the field “**Birthday**” is filled in, an alarm is automatically created in the Calendar.

 If you use your phone abroad, store the numbers in your contact lists in international format “+” followed by the country code (see page 16).

### 5.4 Creating a new contact list

From the product contact list, press the right softkey and select “**Create list**”, confirm using the  key, then name your new contact list. You can create up to 13 new lists. You can delete only those lists that you created, by selecting “**Delete list**”.

### 5.5 Using voice tag

Voice tag allows you to place your call by pronouncing the party’s name without using your contact list.

Select a contact from the phone list and press the “**Options**” softkey. Then select “**Voice tag**” and confirm once again. Three different beeps will signal the start of recording, its failure or its success. After recording, you can “**Listen to**”, “**Replace**” or “**Delete**” a recorded voice tag.

 The contacts for which a voice tag has been recorded are indicated by the  icon. The number of names accessible through voice tag is limited. This feature can be used in all lists except the SIM card list.

Activate voice tag by a long keypress on the  key from the main screen, then follow the instructions on the screen.

### 5.6 Assigning a ringtone to a contact list

Select a contact from the phone list, press the right softkey and select “**Dir. ringtone**”.

When you receive a call from a contact classified in that list, the ringtone will be the one assigned to the list.

### 5.7 Assigning an image, an animation or a video to a contact

Select a contact from the contact list, press the right softkey and select “**Image**”.

When you receive a call from that contact, the picture, animation or video clip that you have chosen will be displayed on the screen. It is possible to assign either an image or a video but not both for the same contact.

### 5.8 Call logs

You can access your call memory by pressing the  key from the main screen. You must first choose the appropriate icon:



 The icons that may be displayed to the left of the person’s name show the type of telephone number recorded in the contact list (Home, Office, Mobile Phone).

#### Available options

From the stored number, you can access the following options using the right softkey:

## 5.9 Speed dial list

By customising your keys, you can call someone or access a function directly from the main screen.

Access this feature by selecting “**Contacts**” from the main menu, press  and select “**Speed dial list**”. You can also access this function in the “**Settings**”, then select “**Profiles**” then “**Speed dial list**”.

Choose the key that you wish to programme. Then select:

- “**Contact list**” activate this option if you want to access directly from the main screen to the contact whose first letter corresponds to the first letter of the key for instance  key for “PETERSON John”.
- “**Custom keys**”: direct access to the numbers or functions you have programmed. If you want to change them, press the “**Options**” softkey, select “**Modify**”; then choose the first key you wish to program, and select one of following options:
  - “**Numbers**” to programme a direct call to a specific phone number from this key from the main screen,
  - “**Function**” to assign a specific function to the selected key,Repeat this operation key by key.

## 5.10 My Numbers

Access this feature by selecting “**Contacts**” from the main menu, press  and select “**My Numbers**”.

### My Number

Save your mobile phone number. Type in the number and confirm by pressing .

### Voicemail

Modify the number to access your voicemail. This will usually have already been entered for you by Vodafone.

## 5.11 My e-mail

Access this feature by selecting “**Contacts**” from the main menu, press  and select “**My E-mail**”.

Enter your own e-mail address to be able to more easily send pictures, images, video clips, sounds... by MMS to your PC.

You can do it also directly from the options while writing an MMS.

## 6 Messages

From your telephone, you can read, write, send and receive short “**SMS**” messages and “**MMS**” and share them with other mobiles.

MMS messages are messages whereby you can send videos, images, photos, animations, sounds, voice messages (or Voice MMS: simplified MMS that allows you to send a voice memo as a message), appointments (V.CAL) or contact files (V.CARD) to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.

To access the messages from the main screen, press the  key, select “**Messages**” with the navigation key and confirm with the  key.

The following list is displayed:

- Create message
- Inbox
- Outbox
- Voicemail
- My messages
- Media Album (URL)
- Vodafone Mail (URL)
- Messenger (URL)
- Parameters
- Memory
- Delete

When **viewing** your messages, you will find the following status icons, depending on:

- the type of message:  SMS message,  MMS message,  MMS notification,  MMS sending in progress,  MMS message with a sound,  MMS with video clip,  MMS with copyright elements which cannot be forwarded.
- Storage:  messages stored on your SIM card (SMS only),  messages stored in the phone's memory (MMS notifications).

### 6.1 Receiving and reading messages

#### 6.1.1 SMS

When a new SMS arrives, the following message is displayed: “**New message!**”, a beep sounds, the  icon shows up, a line with the number of messages appears on the screen. Select this line and press  to read it directly from the main screen. To modify or deactivate the audible signal, see page 71.

#### 6.1.2 MMS

You have three ways of managing the reception of MMS: immediate, deferred or restricted reception. From “**Parameters/MMS parameters**”, confirm your choice in the “**Mode**” option (see page 39).

- “**Immediate**” reception: when in idle mode, the  icon will indicate that a new MMS is being downloaded. The message “**New message!**” appears, a beep sounds, the  icon shows up, a line with the number of messages appears on the screen. Select this line and press  to select and open the MMS.

To access the menu from the idle screen, and you do not want to open incoming MMS, press  to delete the idle screen notification. The messages are kept in the “**Messages/Received/Not read**” folder.

- “**Deferred**” reception: you will receive a notification with the name and number of the sender and the title of the message if there is one. You can download the MMS at any time in order to read it. You can also delete it without reading it; in this case the sender of the MMS will be informed that it has been rejected (only in National mode).
- “**Restricted**” reception: same behavior as “**Deferred**” mode but you will not receive any notification, only the  icon (only in International mode).

You can receive videos, photos, images, or sounds by MMS. If you select “**Options/Save items**” you can save the videos, images or sounds or all of them. If you want to save more than one item, save the first item displayed, then select the “**Next**” softkey to save the second item, etc. They are all saved in “**My Items**”.

### 6.1.3 Options while receiving or viewing messages in Inbox/Outbox

Generally, the common following options are proposed:

<b>Open</b>	• Open and read the content of your message.	<b>Archive</b>	• Save your message in the “ <b>Archive</b> ” folder (phone memory).
<b>Send</b>	• For unsent messages in Outbox.	<b>Forward</b>	• Forward the message to other people.
<b>Modify</b>	• For unsent messages in Outbox.	<b>Sort by date/Sort by size</b>	• Sort the read messages by date or by size: by date is the default sorting.
<b>Delete</b>	• Delete the message.		
<b>Reply</b>	• Reply by SMS, MMS or by Voice MMS.		

The following options depend on the context (receiving a message, reading in the Inbox or Outbox, an MMS or an SMS):

#### SMS additional options:

<b>Move</b>	• Cut /paste SMS from SIM to product memory.	<b>Save template</b>	• Save the message as a predefined message.
<b>Save picture</b>	• Save a picture contained in the message.	<b>Save number</b>	• Save a number or an e-mail address contained in the message.
<b>Save animation</b>	• Save an animation contained in the message.	<b>Launch WAP</b>	• Go to the WAP address contained in the message.
<b>Save melody</b>	• Save a melody contained in the message.		

#### MMS additional options:

- when selecting an MMS in the inbox/outbox list <sup>(1)</sup>:

<b>Open/Retrieve</b>	• Read the selected message (“ <b>Retrieve</b> ” if the deferred mode has been selected).	<b>Reply all</b>	• Reply to all MMS recipients.
<b>Details</b>	• Go to MMS details: local date, title, size, class, priority, mailing list, ack. of receipt.	<b>Save no./e-mail</b>	• Save the senders’ number or e-mail address in your contact list.

- when reading an MMS:

<b>Restart</b>	• View the message again.	<b>Save items</b> <sup>(2)</sup>	• Save video clips, images, sounds received in MMS current page.
<b>With sound/Without sound</b>	• View your MMS with or without sound.		

In addition:

- If the MMS includes a wap address, an e-mail address, or a telephone number, you have the 2 possibilities: select the “**Options**”, to save and/or access the link displayed (launch wap link, send e-mail, or call number displayed).
- If the MMS contains several pages, it will scroll automatically. To launch the viewing again, select the option “**Restart**” or use the navigation key .

<sup>(1)</sup> Options available according to the reception mode chosen.

<sup>(2)</sup> - For one object press  to save.  
 - For several objects press “**Options**”, choose the objects one by one using the option “**Next**”, and press  to save.

## 6.2 Creating and sending messages

### 6.2.1 Creating SMS

From the main menu, select “**Messages/Create message**”, select “**SMS**” and press . You can also modify a predefined message selecting “**My messages**”.

Customise your messages adding pictures, sounds or mood icons available in your telephone. While writing a message, select the “**Options**” softkey:

Select “**Preview**” to see the whole message: the icons, sounds and mood icons are represented by the ,  or  symbol. You can also download new sounds and images over WAP (see page 86).



A message of more than 160 characters, or a message containing icons, sounds, or mood icons may be billed as more than one message.

The person receiving the message must be equipped with an EMS compatible mobile phone in order to display the objects or listen to the sounds in your message.

### Options for sending your message

If the acknowledgement of receipt (“**Rpt.**”) is activated in “**Sending/Parameters/SMS parameters**”, (see page 38), when you consult your sent messages, the following symbols will show:

-  **Msg.received:** message sent and delivery report received.
-  **Not received:** message sent and waiting for delivery report, or message not received: you should send the message again.

Other options are available if you choose the predictive entry mode (see page 37).

### 6.2.2 Creating MMS

From the main menu, select “**Messages/Create message/MMS**” and press . By default, you are in edit mode. You can also modify a predefined message selecting “**My messages**”.

Your MMS may contain several pages (maximum memory allocated: 100 KB) ; as you create the MMS you will be informed of the memory used (for all pages).

With the option “**My e-mail**”, you can send images, video clips, sounds, ... to your own preset e-mail address.

If the acknowledgment of receipt (“**Rpt.**”) is activated in “**Sending/Parameters/MMS Parameters**”, you can consult it in the option “**Information**” when selecting a message (see page 39).

You may also attach special files to your MMS such as: a contact from your contact list (Vcard), or an appointment from your calendar (Vcal). They will be displayed in a separate page (select option **“Attachments”**).

Depending on whether your MMS is empty or not, with no file or at least one file attached, you will be given the following options:

- Send to one**
  - Send to one recipient from your **Contact list** or **dial** the number or e-mail or select **“My favourite”** or **“My e-mail”**.
- Send to many**
  - Send to several persons by dialling the numbers (**Dial**), or selecting the numbers, or the group (**“Add group”**) from the **Contact list**.
- Add image**
  - Add a picture or an animation from the **“Image album”** function, or create it directly from the **“Take a picture”** function.
- Add video**
  - Add a video from the **“Videos”** function.
- Add sound**
  - Add a sound from the **“Sounds”** function, or a voice message.
- Add text**
  - Write your text.
- Add title**
  - Give a title to your MMS.
- Add bookmark**
  - Insert a bookmark (URL) from the list of your favourite sites (see page 58).
- Text options**
  - - **“->Directory”**: insert a contact number.
  - - **“Symbols”**: insert a symbol.
  - - **“Predictive”**: switch between normal and predictive mode.
- Replace**
  - Change an item in your MMS.
- Remove object**
  - Remove an item in your MMS.
- Add page**
  - Add a page to your MMS.
- Previous page**
  - Go to the previous page of your MMS.
- Next page**
  - Go to the next page of your MMS.
- Delete page**
  - Delete the current page.
- Attachments**
  - Add a Vcard or Vcal.
- Preview**
  - Preview the MMS you created.
- Save**
  - Save your message if you do not want to send it immediately.
- Save canned**
  - Save your message as a predefined one.

Reply to an MMS by sending an MMS, an SMS or a Voice MMS message. To send text only, it is advisable to use an SMS.

To send your MMS later on (after sending other items or photos for instance) save your MMS (**“Save”**) as a draft stored in your **“Outbox/Unsent”** folder. Then select it and use the function **“Options”** to replace or remove items before sending it.

If the message is not sent, the mobile will try to re-send it automatically <sup>(1)</sup>. The  icon is displayed on the screen and in the **“Outbox/Unsent”** folder, indicating the automatic sending procedure is activated. If it fails completely, you will be notified by a message and the  icon in your **“Unsent”** folder indicates that the MMS could not be sent. Select it and press  to send it again, modify it or delete it.

### 6.2.3 Creating a postcard from your mobile phone

From the main menu, select **“Messages/Create Message/MMS Postcard”**. Select the photo you want to send (only photos with VGA format can be sent), press  and then Choose to insert it. Type the message to be printed on the postcard and follow the instructions to complete the details for the address (use  to advance). A real postcard will be sent automatically by post to the contact you entered. You can also take a picture and send it by postcard just after selecting **“Send/Send by/MMS Postcard”**.

 You can only send a postcard with a VGA format picture (see page 45).

### 6.2.4 Creating Voice MMS (Voice recorder)

From the main menu, select **“Messages/Create message/Voice MMS”**. This function allows you to send a message quickly without having to type. The recipient simply receives a normal MMS <sup>(2)</sup>. You can reply to any message using a **“Voice MMS”**.

<sup>(1)</sup> Contact Vodafone to check service availability.

<sup>(2)</sup> This Voice MMS being a normal MMS which contains an AMR type sound, you can only listen to it with an AMR IETF compatible phone or a computer equipped with an adequate sound decoder.

### 6.3 Speed writing system

The **“Predictive”** mode allows to speed the writing of your SMS or MMS. When you want to write a message, press the **“Options”** softkey, select **“Predictive”** for SMS, or select **“Text options”** then **“Predictive”** for MMS and begin to type ; for instance for **“hello”** type on the following keys , , , ,  once. The letter or word displayed may not always correspond to the desired one but continue typing and the system will make better suggestions as you continue to input letters.

When in predictive mode, type the first letter:

- if it corresponds to a single word (for instance a), the letter will be displayed,
- if it does not exist as a single word (for instance h), the symbol **“\*”** will be displayed.

The cursor shape varies depending on the input mode selected:  in predictive input mode,  in normal mode.

To confirm a word and insert a space, press the  key to the right or press the  key downwards or press the  key.

#### Specific keys Normal mode / Predictive mode

 **Short keypress:** Move between automatic capitals  **Abc** , upper case  **ABC** , lower case  **abc** , digits  **123** .

**Long keypress:** Switch between the normal and predictive mode.

 **Normal:** Insert a **“+”**, **“0”** or **“\*”**.

**Predictive:** View other words in the dictionary.

 **Normal:** Display the symbols table.

#### Available options

In addition to the available options in the normal entry mode, you will also find the following choices:

**Confirm word** • Confirm the selected word.

**Other words** • View other possible words.

**Add word** • Add a word to your personal dictionary.

**Add numbers** • Go to the numeric mode.

**Normal** • Switch to the normal mode.

**Languages** • Use the dictionary in another language.

**Save** • Save the message.

You have a personal dictionary which allows you to add, modify or delete words. While writing a message, you can add a word by pressing the **“Options”** softkey and by selecting **“Add word”**, then .

### 6.4 Parameters

From the main menu, select **“Messages”** and using the navigation key to the right, select the  icon.

#### 6.4.1 SMS Parameters

- **Service centre (“SC”)** <sup>(1)</sup>: phone number of Vodafone’s service centre (it may be provided automatically).
- **E-mail centre (“EC”)** <sup>(1)</sup>: the number of the server for sending e-mails (it may be provided automatically).
- **Delivery report (“Rpt:”)**: request for acknowledgement of receipt for each message sent.
- **Message validity (“Val:”)**: the time period during which attempts to send the message to the recipient will be repeated in case of failure.
- **Format (“Typ:”)**: format to be used for delivery of message to recipient (SMS, fax, etc.).
- **Memory (“Mem:”)**: product or SIM (see page 39).

<sup>(1)</sup> Contact Vodafone for details to fill in these fields.

#### 6.4.2 MMS Parameters

- **MMS profiles (“Profile”)** <sup>(1)</sup>: To set your MMS profile, follow the same procedure as for setting your WAP connection (see page 58).
- **Mode**: choose between immediate, deferred or restricted reception for national and international network coverage (see page 30).
- **Delivery report (“Rpt:”)**: request for acknowledgement of receipt for each message sent.
- **Message validity (“Val:”)**: the time period during which attempts to send the message to the recipient will be repeated in case of failure.
- **Memory (“Mem:”)**: to store your sent messages.
- **Timer**: sets the speed at which the pages scroll through: the recipient will see the message at this speed.
- **Filters**: Anonymous MMS filtering: to receive or not anonymous messages
- **Layout configuration**: choose between display: image first then text or text then image.

#### 6.4.3 Saving parameters

You can change the saving parameters for your messages:

- Sent SMS are saved by default in the phone memory:  
Select “**SMS parameters**” and “**Mem:**” to choose “**SIM memory**” or “**Phone memory**”, or “**Not saved**”.

<sup>(1)</sup> Contact Vodafone for details to fill in these fields.

- Sent MMS are stored by default on the product:  
Select “**MMS parameters**” and “**Mem:**” to choose “**Phone memory**” or “**Not saved**”.

For information:

- Received SMS are always in the SIM card,
- Received MMS are always in the phone.

You can always save your messages in the “**Archive**”. They will then be stored in the phone.

#### 6.4.4 Create a distribution list

In the “**Parameters**” folder, select “**Distribution list**”, confirm with  key, then name the group. You can now enter the phone numbers for the members of your new distribution list.

#### 6.4.5 My favourite

Enter the number or email of your favourite contact. Then, when you want to send a message, select “**Send**” and “**My favourite**” directly without searching in the contact list.

#### 6.4.6 My e-mail

Enter your own e-mail address (if not entered yet under the option “**My e-mail**” of the “**Contacts**” menu, see page 28) to be able to easily send images, pictures, sounds, ... by MMS to your computers.

## 6.5 Deleting messages

To delete all messages on your SIM card or in the phone, select the  icon and then the following options:

- **“Delete SIM msg”**: delete all messages received and sent from the SIM.
- **“Delete phone msg”**: delete all messages stored in the phone’s memory.



The  icon appears when the SIM card is full. To receive new SMS, delete some old ones.

## 6.6 Memory status

View available memory space.

Your telephone’s memory is shared between several functions: contact list, calendar, messages, voice messages, voice tag, images and melodies, games and applications, video clips. For example, if you use a lot of memory for your voice memos, you will have less memory available for the contact list.



Do not forget to delete large items such as voice memos, MMS, images, photos, recorded sounds, applications, video clips..., in order to free up memory space.

# 7 Camera

Your phone is fitted with a camera allowing you to take photos, short animations that you can use in different ways :


- store them in your **“My Items”**,
- send them in a multimedia message (MMS) to a mobile phone or an e-mail address (see page 35),
- customise your main screen (see page 72),
- assign them to a contact (see page 26),
- transfer them by IRDA to your computer using Alcatel One Touch PC Suite,
- modify your photos adding frames, stamps, etc (see page 48).

## 7.1 Taking a picture

Your phone must be switched on to take a photo. To access this function from the main screen, press the  key. The screen acts as viewfinder. Position the object or landscape in the viewfinder. The lens is situated on the back of the phone. Please do not touch it. Just next to the lens there is a mirror to make sure you are well placed if you want to take a photo of yourself.

You can take a photo in Portrait or in Landscape mode

- Portrait mode: short keypress on ;
- Landscape mode: short press on one of the side keys.



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### 7.2 Burst shots

Make a long keypress on the upperside key. The shots are taken as long as the press on the key is maintained (maximum number of pictures in a burst: 15). Then, by using the options menu, you can send this burst in an MMS.

### 7.3 Taking a photo with sound

You can record a background sound, while you are taking a picture (long press on the lower side key). A screen will ask you to record your sound. If you release your finger, the recording will stop. Press to return to the photo shot screen.



Please use your camera sensibly. Respect others and observe current regulations in your country.

### 7.4 Photo settings

Before taking the photo, you can adjust a number of settings.

Selected options bar:

- ☆☆ photo quality
- ⚙ white balance
- capture mode
- 1 Exposure (over/under)
- 2/4 number of photos taken (for animation and mosaic)
- Timer

Side keys:

- short keypress up or down: take a photo
- long keypress up: burst shot
- long keypress down: take a photo + sound

Left softkey: **Shoot**

Key **Colour mode:** colour or black&white

Key **Capture mode**

- : Single
- : Animation x 4
- : Mosaic

Key :

- Short keypress: take photo
- Long keypress: take a photo + sound
- Exposure:
- Left: underexposure
- Right: overexposure
- Zoom:
- Up: zoom in
- Down: zoom out

Right softkey: **Options**

Key :

- From idle: access to camera
- In Framing mode:
- short keypress: shoot
- long keypress: take a photo with sound

**Quality:**

- ☆☆☆ : High - key
- ☆☆ : Standard - key
- ☆ : Economy - key

Key : **White balance**

Key **Image size:**

- Panoramic
- VGA
- XL/L/M/S

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Access the settings from the Menu before taking the photo: select the **“Camera”** item from the main menu, select **“Take a picture”** then press the **“Options”** softkey:

### Image size

Select **“Image size”** in the list of options or press the  key until you reach the size you require: VGA (640x480) and Panoramic (360x640) are optimised to be sent to a PC, XL (128x160) and L (128x128) are for local use or MMS, M (64x64) is used to assign the image to a contact for instance, S (32x32) is used to create your very own stamps (see page 48).

### Capture mode

Select **“Capture mode”** in the options list or keep pressing the  key to choose from one of the following modes:

-  **Single:** a single photo; this is the default mode.
-  **Animation x 4:** in this mode, you can take 4 consecutive photos like a small slide show. The number at the top right of the screen shows you which photo you are on: 1/4, 2/4, ..., 4/4. When you have taken the 4th photo, the animation will start automatically.
-  **Mosaic:** in this mode, you will get an image made up of 4 thumbnails. To do this, proceed as for the animation, once the **“Mosaic”** has been selected (see above).

 The burst shoot mode is available by a long keypress on the upperside key.

### Frame

Choose a frame from the list offered and press . The frame will be placed in your photo shot screen; if the image is to your liking, press on the  key to take the photo. You will also find this option in the **“Modify”** function (see page 48).

### Quality

Select **“Quality”** in the list of options or access it directly by pressing the , ,  keys:

- \*\*\*: High quality: excellent quality to be sent to a PC,
- \*\* : Standard quality: balance between size and quality,
- \* : Economy quality: memory space is optimized.



**Warning:** the higher the quality, the more memory is required. For example, if you have 1 MB of free memory, you may store the following number of photos:

Format	High quality	Low quality
VGA	10 photos*	20 photos*
128 x 160	146 photos*	340 photos*

### Timer

The photo will be taken 10 seconds after pressing . A sound will be emitted when you take a photo (if your telephone is in Sound mode).

### White balance

By pressing the **“Options”** function key, you can choose from 5 settings:

Auto: the settings adjust automatically (no icon will be displayed on your screen),

-  sunny,
-  cloudy,
-  night time,
-  indoors/artificial light.



In a dark atmosphere, select **“Night”** to improve the picture quality.

\* These estimations are only given as an indication.

## Colour

You can choose the colour effects. You can access this option directly from the photo shot screen by pressing the  key.

## Direct access to “Pictures”

Access the “**Pictures**” folder directly (to create a folder for instance) to put your picture.

## Default folder

You can change the folder where your photos will be stored automatically.



You can create your own folders using the “**Pictures**” option. Press , then the “**Options**” softkey and select “**Create folder**”.

## Other direct access options from the photo shot screen

**Exposure:** adjust the contrast of your photo with the navigation key: to the left = underexposure, to the right = overexposure.

**Zoom:** activate the zoom with the up/down navigation key: up: zoom in, down: zoom out (depending on the image size).

## 7.5 Options available just after taking the photo

Once you have taken a photo or an animation, you can access the following options:

## 7.6 Modifying images

This option enables you to “**Reduce**” image size, to “**Add stamp**” or “**Add frame**”. You have two possibilities for accessing images in order to modify them:

- Via the “**My Items/Pictures**” menu:  
Choose an image, press  and select “**Options**” then “**Modify**”.
- Via the “**Camera**” menu <sup>(1)</sup>:  
Just after taking the photo, press the right softkey to access “**Options**” and select “**Modify**”.

## 7.7 Direct access to the photo capture or to “My Items” from MMS composition

With the option “**Add image**”, you can also access the photo function or “**My Items**” (picture/image/video/sound) directly while you are writing a Multimedia Message (MMS) (see page 35).

You have two ways to insert a photo in an MMS:

- Either by adding an existing photo to your MMS taken from “**My Items/Pictures**”:  
when you are in the “**Messages**” menu, select successively “**Create message**”, “**MMS**”, press , press the “**Options**” softkey, select “**Add image**”, then “**Image album**” album and select a photo.
- Or by taking a new photo:  
same process, but instead of selecting the “**Image album**” album, select “**Take a picture**”.

## 8 Games & more .....

Your Alcatel phone may include some Java™ applications and games. You can also download new applications and games to your phone from Vodafone live!.

The “**Games & more**” menu allows you to manage the Java™ applications installed in your phone. It includes the following folders:

-  **General**: contains all applications and games,
-  **Settings**: contains your sound, backlighting and network settings.

### 8.1 Launch an application

Select the application. Press the “**Launch**” softkey or  then “**Launch**”.

## 8.2 Available options

- Launch** • Launch the application.
- Information** • This option gives information on the application.
- Download** • Download an application.
- Delete** • Deletes the application. If you delete a pre-installed application in your phone, you may, depending on the application, be able to download it again from Vodafone live! However, some applications cannot be re-downloaded.

## 8.3 Download an application

You can download new Java™ applications in the “**Games & more**” menu by selecting the “**Download**” softkey. The list of available WAP bookmarks dedicated to the application download will then be displayed. Select the appropriate bookmark to go to the desired WAP page.

The downloaded applications can be saved either in the Games folder or Application folder.

## 8.4 Java™ Push

You may receive Java™ Push messages inviting you to launch new applications.

## 8.5 Settings

- **Sound off/ Sound on** Switch sound ON/OFF for all applications.
- **Backlight** Activate or deactivate the backlight.
- **Networks** List of network profiles available for Games & more. This list comprises the current WAP profiles and specific profiles for Games & more. To select a profile, go to the list, press **OK** and select “**Confirm**”. To modify a specific profile for Games & more, go to the list, press **OK** and select “**Modify**”. To create a profile, go to the list, press **OK** and select “**Create**”. For the options available, see page 58.
- **Memory** View memory available. Applications use shared memory (see page 41).

### While an application is running

- Short keypress on **ESC**: pause
- Long keypress on **ESC**: exit the application

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## 9 Calendar.....

Your phone has a sophisticated calendar that will help you to manage your daily schedule. You can also save “to do” lists.

### 9.1 Consulting your calendar

Three views are possible. You must first choose the appropriate icon:

-  Daily view
-  Weekly view
-  Monthly view
-  “To Do” list.
-  Parameters

You can scroll through the dates by pressing the  key.

According to the view you can read, create, modify or send an item.

-  Information in the contact list and the calendar may be shared with a computer using the Alcatel One Touch PC suite (see page 86).

## 9.2 Creating an appointment and programming an alarm

When you create an appointment (“Create” option), you can also activate an alarm. You can set the desired alarm activation time to coincide with your appointment time.

## 9.3 Creating a task

Scroll to the  icon using the  key, and confirm using the  key. Select “Select type”, then confirm once again using the  key and enter the type of task to be performed (“to do” or call appointment), then enter the purpose.

This list can be arranged by deadline or by priority. To do this, scroll to the  icon using the  key, then confirm using the  key.

You can set an alarm for a task for which you have set a due date. This alarm will sound on the chosen day at the time that you entered.

## 9.4 Configure the calendar

Scroll to the  icon using the  key, to access the following options:

## Vodafone live!

### 1.1 Access WAP menu

Vodafone live! is a service that allows you to access the mobile Internet, where you can obtain information such as weather conditions, news, sport and download new ringtones, wallpapers, etc.

- “**Vodafone live!**” launches the Vodafone live! portal homepages.
- “**Bookmarks**” gives access to the list of your favourite sites or add new sites to them.
- “**Enter URL**” allows you to directly access the WAP page for which you enter the URL address.
- “**Profiles**” lists the Wap profiles.

### 1.2 Programming your access

Vodafone has already pre-configured your phone, however, you can select a profile from the “**Profiles**” list and access the following options by pressing the  key:

To “**Create**” or “**Modify**” a profile, you are required to replace the following parameters:

- Profile name
- Homepage
- IP address
- Security
- Bearer choice
- Confirm

In the “**Bearer choice**” item you can choose the transmission mode: **GPRS/GSM, GPRS** or **GSM**.



When you select the GPRS/ GSM transmission mode, GSM mode is activated if GPRS mode is not available.

If you select the **GPRS** transmission mode, select a GPRS bearer and then fill in the following parameters:

- Authentication (user name and password)
- APN

If you select the **GSM** transmission mode, select a GSM bearer and then fill in the following parameters:

- User name
- Password
- Telephone number
- Access type

If you select the **GPRS/GSM** transmission mode, select a GPRS bearer and then a GSM bearer; fill in the required parameters for each one.

### 11.3 GPRS function

Your mobile phone has an efficient high-speed modem based on GPRS technology. With this modem you will be able to surf faster on the WAP and send your MMS more quickly. This service may be billed at a different rate (contact Vodafone for more information).

The **G** icon appears when the GPRS context is active.

### 11.4 WAP browser options

Once you have launched the Wap browser, while reading a page, you can access to the options by selecting the right softkey “**Options**”, or press  (long keypress).

At any time during your navigation, a long keypress on the  key allows you to exit the WAP mode.

## 12 My Items

To access “My Items” from the main screen, press the navigation key to the left or to the right  or press  and select the  icon. “My Items” is a function that groups together all visual and sound items in your telephone, regardless of whether they are embedded, downloaded, recorded or composed.

### 12.1 Pictures

You can select an image or a photo and use it as the main screen wallpaper or the ON/OFF screen wallpaper. You may change it, send it by MMS or assign it to a contact in the contact list using the “Image” option (see page 26).

The “Pictures” album is made up of the following folders <sup>(1)</sup>:

-  **General:** list of all images (built-in or created) from all album folders.
-  **Photos:** default folder for pictures taken with the camera.
-  **Pictures:** contains all images not belonging in one of the other folders.
-  **Icons:** contains EMS, stamps...
-  **Frames:** contains frames for enhancing your images.

<sup>(1)</sup> The embedded folder names cannot be modified. However, in certain cases, you can modify, delete and add items included in these folders.

For easier searching, the images/photos are displayed on the screen in reduced size. To view one image at a time, select an image, press  and click on “View”.

Then, from this view you can scroll through the images by making a short keypress on . A long keypress will start the slide show (or press the right softkey “Options” then “Slideshow”).

### 12.2 Games & more

See page 50.

### 12.3 Sounds

Choose a sound for the ON/OFF screen, for an incoming call, a message alert or an alarm (see page 70).

The “Sounds” album is made up of the following folders <sup>(1)</sup>:

-  **General,** contains all sound items (built-in or created) from all album folders,
-  **Melodies,**
-  **Crazy sounds,**
-  **Recorded** sounds (only contains recordings made with the “Record” function and the “Memo-> Album” function),
-  **Composed** sounds (only contains compositions made using “Compose”).

<sup>(1)</sup> The embedded folder names cannot be modified. However, in certain cases, you can modify, delete and add items included in these folders.

## 12.4 Videos

The “Videos” album is made up of the following folders <sup>(1)</sup>:

 **General**, contains all the items from all the folders (created and embedded)

 **Crazy clips**,

 **Video trailers**.

While playing a video, you can adjust the volume with the  key or the side keys.

 You can search any Image, Sound or Video files by pressing the key bearing the first character of the filename.

## 12.5 Managing sounds, images and videos

According to the item chosen, you can access some of the following functions:

### View

- View the image selected. If you want to view all the pictures of your folder in a slideshow press  on the current picture.

### Listen to

- Listen to the sound selected.

### Play

- Play the video selected.

### Send <sup>(1)</sup>

- Send sound/image/video.

### Delete

- Delete image/sound/video selected (Not for built-in items).

### Set as

- - Image->main screen, switch ON/OFF, assign it to a contact.
- Sound->ringtone, switch ON/OFF, assign it to a contact.
- Video->to a contact.

### Ringtones

- Choose a melody for an incoming call ringtone.

### Modify

- Modify sound/image/video <sup>(2)</sup>.

### Download

- Access to your bookmark sites to download new items.

### Rename

- Rename image/video/sound.

### Classify file

- Move an image/video/sound from a folder to another.

### Create folder

- Create folders grouping together a series of images or sounds (for example: “**Holidays**” or “**Birthday**”).

### Delete folder

- Delete a folder.

### Rename folder

- Rename a folder that you created.

### Empty folder

- Empty the contents of a folder.

### Sort by size/

- Sort the images by size or by alphabetical order.

### Sort by name

### Camera access

- Access the photo taking mode directly.

- Image: JPEG (.jpg)<sup>(2)</sup>; GIF (.gif); PNG (.png); BMP (.bmp)
- Video: 3GP (.3gp) (H263<sup>(3)</sup> + AMR<sup>(1)</sup> or MPEG-4<sup>(4)</sup>)  
MP4 (.mp4) (MPEG-4<sup>(4)</sup>)
- You can convert large image and sound files using the PC software suite so that they are compatible with your terminal.

## 12.8 My shortcuts

Access the own shortcuts already programmed.

To programme new shortcuts, select “**Set my shortcuts**” if you want to have a quick access to a function or a telephone number.

# 13 Application.....

## 13.1 Alarms

### Alarm clock

First set the alarm frequency (daily or only once), then enter the time and date and confirm by pressing the  key. You can also enter the purpose of the alarm and then confirm with the  key.

### Timer


Set the amount of time desired before the alarm is to sound and confirm with the  key.

### Options

When the alarm is set, the  icon is displayed on the main screen. The alarm will sound whether the handset is switched on or off and can be shut off by pressing the  key.

If you have chosen the “**Snooze**” option, the alarm will sound at regular 10 minute intervals.

## 13.2 Calculator



Enter a number and confirm with the  key, then select the type of operation to be performed using the  key and confirm again.

Enter the second number and press .

Select the “=” sign to display the result.

To return to the main screen, press the  key (long keypress).

### 13.3 Converter

The currency converter allows you to:

- Convert a currency directly into euros and vice versa <sup>(1)</sup>.
- Convert a sum of money into another currency (e.g. dollars to pounds).

For a conversion into euros, you can modify the default currency by selecting **“Set up”**.

If converting between international currencies, both currencies must be selected. You must also enter the appropriate exchange rate.

An exchange rate value is pre-set for each currency. You can change this value by selecting **“Set up”**.



From the main screen, enter the amount in euros to be converted into the programmed currency, then press the **OK** key and select **“Converter”**.

### 13.4 Voice recorder

The voice memo feature enables you to record personal messages. To record a voice memo, select **“Voice recorder”**, then **“Record”**, and begin speaking after the beep. Once the voice memo has been created, you can access the following options:



### 13.5 Tone maker

Access this feature by selecting **“Application”** for the main menu, then **“Tone maker”**.

#### 13.5.1 Compose

Select **“Compose”** then use the keypad as shown below:



#### 13.5.2 Record

Select **“Record”** to record a sound of your own.

In both cases, you can use these sounds to use them as a melody. If you want to listen to a sound (composed or recorded), select the desired one and press the **“Options”** softkey.

### 13.6 Infrared (IrDA)

Access this feature by selecting “**Application**” from the main menu, then “**Infrared**”.

Your phone’s infrared feature allows you to exchange contacts, calendar data, images, videos, melodies via an infrared link with an other mobile or a PC. The infrared port is located on the top of your phone.

#### Sending data

To send data, select the contact file, then select the “**Data transfer**” option. It is not necessary to activate the infrared feature before sending.

#### Receiving data

To receive data, you must activate the infrared feature. A message will advise you of the arrival of data; you then save the data by pressing the  key or reject it using the  key.

Once you have selected the option, the  icon appears on your screen. Infrared will be deactivated automatically after a short while <sup>(1)</sup>. The connection will cut off if you have an incoming call. You can receive up to three calling cards (V.Card) or appointments (V.Cal) at the same time.

### 13.7 Alarms list

Access this feature by selecting “**Application**” from the main menu, then “**Alarms list**”.

You can view all the alarms that you have set (Appointment, To Do, Alarm clock). The  icon will appear on your main screen if the alarm clock or the timer have been set, or if the alarm is set for the current day or the following day.

<sup>(1)</sup> If you use infrared often, we advise that you set a quick access to it from the keypad (see page 27).

## 14 Settings

From the main screen, select the icon menu , press  and select the function of your choice in order to customise your telephone.

### 14.1 Profiles

#### 14.1.1 Ringtones

##### Available functions

To modify the sound settings, select the different options using the  key:

-  Select a melody in the list using the  key then confirm by pressing .
- You can also select in this list the random melody function called “**Surprising melody**” (see page 71).
-  Mode (normal, discreet, vibrator...).
-  Adjust the volume using the  key.
-  Select the type of key beep.
-  Select a melody for a new incoming message.
-  Select a melody for an appointment.
-  Select a melody for an alarm.
-  Select the type of network beep.

**Mode**

**Normal**

- Normal ringtone (increasing volume).

**Discreet**

- Normal ringtone (increasing volume) preceded by beeps.

**Vibrate**

- Activate the vibrator and mute all sounds (ringtone, message beep, appointment alarm, low battery alert). The  icon will be displayed.

**Vibrate and ring**

- Vibrator and the normal ringtone at the same time.

**Vibrate then ring**

- Vibrator followed by beeps then the normal ringtone (increasing volume).

**Beep and vibrate**

- Warning beep followed by the vibrator.

**Silence**

- No sound or beep except for alarms. The  icon will be displayed.



Some of these modes may be deactivated when using certain accessories (full duplex hands-free car kit, ...).

**Surprising melody**

In the top of the list of melodies, access the item “**Surprising melody**”; choose all the melodies you want. Then, at each incoming call, one of the melodies you have chosen will be played randomly.

**14.1.2 Themes**

Access this feature by selecting “**Settings**” from the main menu, then “**Profiles**” and “**Themes**”.

This menu allows you to customise your telephone to suit your own taste. You can modify 7 customisable items at the same time. A Theme comprises:

4 visual items:

- ON screen image/animation
- OFF screen image/animation
- Main screen image/animation
- Skins and colours

3 sound items:

- 1 melody for incoming calls
- 1 melody when the telephone is switched on
- 1 melody for notification of incoming messages

When using the telephone for the first time, a default Theme is activated.

Even if you choose a Theme, you can still modify the elements in it one by one. You can reactivate a Theme at any time.

When changing a Theme, an installation screen appears until the 7 elements are installed.



The installation of the Theme can be stopped and cancelled if you receive an incoming call or if you press the  key ; the previous choice of Theme is kept.

**14.1.3 Screen**

Access this feature by selecting “**Settings**” from the main menu, then “**Profiles**” and “**Screen**”.

**Main screen**

The main screen is displayed after your telephone has been switched on and/or when no functions have been used for a short time (calls, sending of short messages...).

You can lock and unlock the keypad by making a long keypress on the  key.

You can access the main functions directly from the main screen with the  key.

By selecting the **“Pictures”** you can customise it by replacing the default image or animation displayed on your telephone. If you receive an event (incoming call, SMS/MMS, notifications, etc.) the icon, type and quantity of events will be displayed on your main screen allowing you to consult them directly.

#### Screen saver

If you activate this option, the screen saver will be displayed a little while after the main screen. You can choose a picture, an animation, a slideshow, or a videoclip as your screen saver.



In both cases, Main screen or Screen saver, the eco-mode screen will appear after a little while: only the battery and network levels and the time or an envelope (for incoming event) will be displayed.

#### Colours

This function enables you to customise the skin and the colours of your telephone (menu screens, entry screens, etc.)

#### ON/OFF screens

You can customise your welcome message, animation, melody or image that appears when you switch on your telephone.

You can also customise your OFF screen with an image or animation.

#### Zoom <sup>(1)</sup>

Two character sizes are available for your telephone screen. Large characters is selected by default. If you wish to display more information select **“Zoom”**.

<sup>(1)</sup> Depending on the language.

#### Contrast

Set the contrast of your screen.

#### 14.1.4 Keys

By customising your keys, you can call someone or access a function directly from the main screen (see page 27).

#### 14.1.5 Voice tag

Voice tags allow you to access one of the menu functions by pronouncing the name of that function.

#### Recording a voice tag

In order to record a voice tag for one of the menu functions, select **“Voice tag”** and the desired function and then follow the instructions.

The functions for which a voice tag has been recorded are indicated by the  icon. There are 10 functions accessible through voice tag.

#### Using a voice tag

You activate **“voice tag”** by a long keypress on the  key from the main screen. To use a voice tag, follow the instructions on the screen.

After recording, you can **“Listen to”**, **“Replace”** or **“Delete”** a recorded voice tag command.

## 14.2 Phone

Access this feature by selecting **“Settings”** from the main menu, then **“Phone”**

### 14.2.1 Clock

Access this feature by selecting **“Settings”** from the main menu, then **“Phone”** and **“Clock”**.

You can display two clocks (local and remote) at the same time.

Go first to the **“Clock type”** icon  and select the **“2 clocks”** option. Then go back to the **“Clock set up”**, select **“Local clock”**, choose a city and confirm. The automatic transition to daylight saving time is activated. Repeat the same operation for the **“Remote clock”**.

#### Display format

You can display your clock in analogue or digital format and the date in the following formats: day/month/year, month/date/year or year/month/day in digits or using the first three letters for the day and month.

### 14.2.2 Languages <sup>(1)</sup>

Access this feature by selecting **“Settings”** from the main menu, then **“Phone”** and **“Languages”**.

Display language for messages (select using ). The **“Automatic”** option selects the language according to the subscription network (if available).

## 14.2.3 Dictionary

Access this feature by selecting **“Settings”** from the main menu, then **“Phone”** and **“Dictionary”**.



Notwithstanding any other applicable statutory warranties, this mobile phone is guaranteed against any manufacturing defect for a period of ONE (1) year from the date of purchase shown on your invoice. Nevertheless if the statutory warranty in force in your country exceeds ONE (1) year, the statutory warranty is not affected by the manufacturer's warranty.

The present warranty terms also apply to the battery and accessories but for a period of SIX (6) months from the date of purchase shown on your invoice.

Under the terms of this warranty, you must inform your phone dealer or any maintenance centre approved by Alcatel (see list of maintenance centres at our web site [www.alcatel.com](http://www.alcatel.com)) without delay of any defects and present the invoice given to you at the time of purchase. The phone dealer or the maintenance centre will decide, as appropriate, to replace or repair all or part of the telephone or the accessory found to be defective. This warranty covers parts and labour but excludes all other costs. Repair or replacement may be carried out using reconditioned products offering features equivalent to new products.

Any operations under this warranty, especially repair, modification or replacement of products, will be covered by a warranty of three months, unless other statutory provisions apply.


This warranty shall not apply to damage or defects (to your telephone and/or accessory) caused by:







## 20 Troubleshooting .....

Before contacting the after-sales service, we advise you to perform the following checks:

### **My mobile phone does not switch on**

- Press  until the screen comes on
- Check the battery charge level
- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your telephone back on

### **My phone has not responded for several minutes**

- Press the  key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then switch the phone back on

### **My screen is difficult to read**

- Clean your screen
- Use your mobile phone in accordance with the recommended conditions of use

### **My mobile phone turns off by itself**

- Check that your keypad is locked when you are not using your mobile phone
- Check the battery charge level

### **My mobile phone has a short battery life**

- Make sure you respected the complete charge timing (minimum 3 hours)
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for 20 minutes minimum after you remove the charger to obtain an exact indication

### **My mobile phone does not charge properly**

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; the battery charge indicator can take several minutes and may be accompanied by a quiet whistling sound
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C +40°C)
- Make sure your battery is inserted. It must be inserted **before** plugging in the charger
- Make sure you are using an ALCATEL battery and charger
- When abroad, check that the electrical current is compatible

**My mobile phone does not connect to a network**

- Try connecting in another location
- Verify the network coverage with Vodafone
- Check with Vodafone that your SIM card is valid
- Try selecting the available network(s) manually (see page 83)
- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded

**SIM card error**

- Make sure the SIM card was correctly inserted (see page 13)

**Unable to make outgoing calls**

- Check your subscription with Vodafone (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not barred outgoing calls (see page 78)

**Unable to receive incoming calls**

- Make sure your mobile phone is switched on and connected to the network (check for overloaded or unavailable network)
- Check your subscription with Vodafone (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not forwarded incoming calls (see page 77)
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls

**The caller's name or number does not appear when a call is received**

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with Vodafone
- Your caller has concealed his/her number

**The sound quality of the calls is not optimal**

- You can adjust the volume during a call by means of the  key
- Check the radio reception icon level 

**I am unable to use the features described in the manual**

- Check that your subscription includes this service
- Check to be sure this feature does not require an ALCATEL accessory.

**When I select a number from my contact list, the number is not dialled**

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file
- Make sure that you have selected the country prefix when calling a foreign country

**I am unable to create a file in my contact list**

- Make sure that your SIM card list is not full; delete some files or save the files in the product list (i.e. your professional or personal lists)
- Check the "Diverts" option for "Incoming calls" to be sure that the "Except SIM Dir." feature is not activated

**My callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail**

- Contact Vodafone to check service availability

**I can't access my voicemail**

- Make sure Vodafone's voicemail number is correctly entered in "My Numbers"
- Try later if the network is busy

**I am unable to send and receive messages MMS, Voice MMS**

- Check your phone memory available as it might be full (see page 41)
- Contact Vodafone to check service availability and check MMS parameters (see page 39)
- Verify the server centre number or your MMS profile with Vodafone
- The server centre may be saturated; try again later

**The  icon is displayed on my main screen**

- You have saved too many short messages on your SIM card; delete some of them or archive them in the product memory

**The << - >> icon is displayed**

- You are outside of the network coverage area

**I have already entered 3 incorrect PIN codes**

- Contact Vodafone to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key)

**I am unable to connect my telephone to my computer**

- Install first of all Alcatel's PC suite
- Use "Install the connection" and perform the installation
- If you use the infrared port, check that it is correctly activated (see page 69)
- If you use infrared often, we advise that you set a quick access to it from the keypad (see page 27).
- Check that your computer meets the requirements for Alcatel's PC Suite installation

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
