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
INSTALLING YOUR TV SET

DO NOT:

- Place your TV set in a room where direct lighting strikes the screen.
- Place your TV set too close to a wall, in a confined area or in a very warm location.
- Change the plug's safety prong. See note below.

DO:

- Use soft and indirect lighting.
- Sit at least 6 feet away from the set.
- Provide normal air circulation for reliable long life.
- Plug into an electrical outlet with standard house power. (120 volt AC, 60 Hz)



Note:

As a safety feature, this plug has one prong wider than the other. It will fit only one way into a standard electrical outlet. If the plug will not fit into the outlet, try turning it around. If the plug will not fit either way, the outlet is probably old and nonstandard. You will need to have a new outlet installed by an electrician.

DO NOT CHANGE THIS SAFETY FEATURE OF THIS PLUG.

ANTENNA/CABLE TV GENERAL INFORMATION

You can use either an indoor or outdoor antenna to receive VHF and/or UHF channels. Channels $2\sim13$ are VHF channels, and channels $14\sim69$ are UHF channels.


We recommend using an outdoor antenna for better picture quality.

You can receive Cable TV by connecting a cable supplied by your local cable company. Cable TV delivers both VHF and UHF channels and other channels not available from your antenna.


TYPES OF ANTENNA CABLES

Shown below are two basic types of antenna cables. Signals from a home antenna may be conducted through either type. Cable TV signals will always be conducted through 75 ohm coaxial cable.


 A 75 ohm system is generally a round cable with F-type connectors that can easily be attached to a terminal without tools.




 A 300 ohm system is a flat "twin-lead" cable that can be attached to a terminal through an antenna adapter supplied as an accessory.




HOME ANTENNA CONNECTION






CABLE TV CONNECTION

Generally, the incoming cable for a cable TV system can be connected directly to the TV antenna terminal just like a home antenna connection. Simply attach it to the ANT 75 Ω terminal. You will be able to receive unscrambled cable channels.



Some cable companies offer "premium pay" channels in which the signal is scrambled. Descrambling these signals for normal viewing requires the use of a descrambler device which is generally provided by the cable company.

• The descrambler device may or may not be a part of the cable converter.





NOTE TO CATV SYSTEM INSTALLER

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the N.E.C., that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.







"A" position on the A/B switch allows you to select unscrambled channels using the TV's channel keys. "B" position on the A/B switch allows you to select scrambled channels via the cable TV converter/decoder using the converter's channel keys. Place your TV and VCR on channel 3 or 4 to match the converter's output channel.

Note: When connected this way, the VIDEO/AUDIO connections from the VCR to the TV are required for stereo playback from stereo VCR's. See page 25 for connection details.






LOCATION OF CONTROLS (Remote Control)

This Remote Control allows you to control the functions of your TV set from 16 feet (5m) away. The "*" marked function buttons do not have duplicate locations on your TV set. They can be controlled only by the Remote Control. For specific use of each control, consult the corresponding page numbers in brackets.

INSTALL THE BATTERIES

- 1. Place the Remote Control with the face down, press down and slide to remove the battery cover.
- 2. Insert two "AAA" batteries, matching the + and signs on each battery to the + and signs in the Unit.
- 3. Replace the battery cover until the lock snaps.

TIPS FOR BEST OPERATION

- Always aim your Remote Control directly at the TV set and be sure there is no obstruction between the Remote Control and the TV set.
- Do not drop, take apart or get your Remote Control wet.
- If you do not use your Remote Control for a long time or if the batteries are worn out, remove them from the Unit to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.
- If your Remote Control does not always adjust the set as you wish, you probably need to replace the batteries.

The life expectancy of the battery is about 1 year.

CAUTION:

- Do not throw your batteries into a fire. Dispose of your batteries in a designated disposal area.
- Do not combine a used old battery with a new one.
- Do not mix battery types.

TV CHANNELS

This TV will receive the following TV signals:

- 1. TV: Off the air TV signals. (VHF channels 2~13, UHF channels 14~69)
- 2. STD CABLE: Standard cable TV channels.
- 3. HRC CABLE: Harmonic Related Carrier cable TV signals.
- 4. IRC CABLE: Incremental Related Carrier cable TV signals.

For each of these systems, your TV set has exact frequencies built into it to ensure precise tuning. For precise tuning, your **CABLE** button must be set to match your TV signal system. The chart on the next page shows channels available in each system and how your TV displays them. When you connect your TV to a cable TV system and if you are not sure what system they are using, proceed with the following section "HOW TO FIND YOUR TYPE OF CABLE SYSTEM" or consult your local cable company to check if your system is STD, HRC or IRC.


HOW TO FIND YOUR TYPE OF CABLE SYSTEM

- 1. Press CABLE to obtain the "STD CABLE" mode.
- 2. Select various channels and confirm whether the channels will lock immediately with perfect picture. If the channels seem to take a few seconds to lock in, your cable system may be one of the other cable systems. In this case, continue with the following steps.
- 3. Press CABLE to obtain the "HRC CABLE" mode and try above procedure again.
- 4. If you are having problems with only channel 5 or 6, you may have an IRC system so change the mode to "IRC CABLE".



Note: The above chart is typical of many cable system channel allocations. However, the numbering system may differ in your area. If in doubt, consult your cable company.

PROGRAMMING CHANNEL MEMORY

Programming channels places available channels into memory so that your TV will stop on these channels when you press the **CHANNEL** ▲ or ▼ button.

- The guickest way to program the channel memory is to use the **PROG** button.
- When it is decided that certain channels should be erased from the memory, the ADD/ ERASE button provides complete programming flexibility.



AUTOPROGRAMMING CHANNELS


- 1 Press POWER to turn on the TV.
- 2 Make sure the CABLE button on the TV set is properly set.
- 3 Press PROG to start autoprogramming. The TV will automatically cycle through all channels and place active channels into the channel memory.
- 4 When the TV is finished cycling, you can check to see which channels are in memory by pressing CH ▲ / ▼.

ADDING/ERASING CHANNELS


- 1 Press the **Channel Number** buttons or **CH** ▲ / ▼ buttons to select the channel to be added or erased.
- 2 To add channels:

Press **ADD/ERASE** until "ADDED" is displayed on the screen.

This channel has now been added to the channel memory.



To erase channels: Press ADD/ERASE until "ERASED" is displayed on the screen. This channel has now been erased from the channel memory.




- **3** Repeat steps 1 and 2 for other channels.
- 4 Press CH ▲ or ▼ to make sure the channels are programmed correctly.

INTRODUCTION OF ON-SCREEN MENU

To adjust any TV feature, the use of the Menu function is required. Before beginning the adjustment or selection, we suggest you familiarize yourself with this procedure. The following chart shows all the menu pages displayed on the screen using the

FUNCTION button and **Function** ▲ / ▼ buttons on the TV.





WATCHING TV PROGRAMS

Generally, the Remote Control is all that is required to operate the TV.





1 Press POWER to turn on the TV. To turn off the TV, press POWER again.



2 Select a channel in one of the following two ways. To scan the memorized channels in numerical sequence

Press CH (CHANNEL) ▲ to select next higher channel

Press **CH (CHANNEL)** ▼ to select next lower channel.

Press the button again to select next memorized channels.

To select a channel directly

Press the **Channel Number** buttons (0~9 and 100). To select channel 4, press "4" (or press "0", "4"). To select channel 38, press "3", "8".

To select channel 125, press "100", "2", "5" in sequence.

3 Press VOLUME ▲ / ▼ to adjust the volume. To increase the volume, press ▲.

To decrease the volume, press ▼.




Notes:

- If a vacant channel is tuned or TV broadcast for a day is finished, the TV will automatically turn off after about 15 minutes by the *Auto Power Off* feature. However, if the off-timer is operating, it takes precedence.
- The VOLUME ▲/▼ buttons on the TV will function as the Function ▲/▼ buttons while any of the menu displays are on the screen. See page 20.

CONVENIENT REMOTE FUNCTIONS




SEARCHING FOR THE PROGRAM YOU WANT TO VIEW

Press **CH SEARCH** once to begin the channel search operation. The TV will automatically cycle through all channels as it will tune in the active channels for a moment each. Press **CH SEARCH** again while the program you want to view is on the screen. Searching will stop at its channel.

CALLING UP THE ON-SCREEN INFOR-MATION

Press **RECALL** to display the channel number and the stereo audio status on the screen.



MUTING THE SOUND

Press **MUTE** to mute the sound immediately without affecting the picture. This is useful during telephone calls or other interruptions.

To restore the sound, press MUTE again.



RECEIVING A STEREO PROGRAM


The MTS button allows you to improve your TV viewing with high fidelity stereo sound. See page 18 for details.

USING THE OFF-TIMER

The **TIMER** button allows you to set the TV to turn off automatically after a certain period of time you set. See page 19 for details.

RECEIVING A STEREO PROGRAM


The Multi-channel TV Sound or MTS feature on this TV allows you to improve your TV viewing with high fidelity stereo sound.



When the TV receives a stereo broadcast, the word "STR" is displayed on the screen whenever the TV is turned on, the channel is selected or the **RECALL** button is pressed.



You can then listen to the stereo sound by pressing the MTS button. Press the button until "STEREO" is displayed on the screen in red.




If a broadcasting signal is not strong enough and noise free stereo sound is not available, select "MONO".

The noise should be reduced.

Note: Please be sure you have selected the STEREO mode if broadcast is in stereo.

USING THE OFF-TIMER (SLEEP)

This feature allows you to set the TV to turn itself off automatically after a certain period of time you set (every 10 minutes, up to 180 minutes or 3 hours). This is useful whenever you want to view TV for an hour or so before going to sleep.



SETTING THE OFF-TIMER

Example: To set the off-timer to turn the TV set off after 150 minutes.




- If you want to know the time remaining, press **TIMER**. Remaining time will be displayed on the screen. To erase the display, press the button again.
- You cannot select channels with the Remote Control if the Timer Display is on the screen.

ADJUSTING PICTURE AND AUDIO

You can adjust the Picture or Audio functions to suit your personal preference.




1 Press **FUNCTION** on the TV until the item you want to adjust is displayed on the screen in red.



2 Press Function ▲ or ▼ while the Picture or Audio menu is on the screen to adjust the item you have selected.

Press and hold either button until your desired level is obtained.



3 Repeat steps 1 and 2 for other items.

Note: Enter each step within 6 seconds.



RESET BUTTON

You can restore all Picture and Audio functions to the factory-preset levels by one push of the **RESET** button on the TV or on the Remote Control.

Pressing the button will automatically set the CONTRAST to the maximum and all other functions (BRIGHTNESS, SHARPNESS, COLOR, TINT, TONE and BALANCE) at the center.



SPEAKER ON/OFF BUTTON

Press **SPEAKER ON/OFF** until "SPEAKERS OFF" is displayed on the screen in red.

The built-in speakers are disconnected.

You will see the words "SPEAKERS OFF" on the screen for about 12 seconds whenever the TV is turned on. To restore the sound, press the button to select "SPEAKERS ON".



CLOSED CAPTION

CAPTION

Closed captioning displays dialogue, narration, and/ or sound effects of a TV program on the screen in a manner similar to subtitles in a movie. Captioning is especially helpful for hearing impaired individuals. Captions will appear at either the top or bottom of the screen during caption broadcasts as shown below.





TO DISPLAY CAPTIONS

- 1 Check your local TV listings for the time and channel number of captioned programs. Programs captioned are usually notated by its service marks such as "CC".
- 2 Press FUNCTION until "C. CAPT" is displayed on the screen in red.

3 Press Function ▲ or ▼ until "CAPT 1" or "CAPT 2" is displayed on the screen in red.

The CAPT 2 mode may be utilized for alternate languages if they are being transmitted.

The TV will display captions automatically if the program you are watching has been captioned.

If you do not want the caption displayed, select "OFF".

Note: The following situations may not be acceptable to decode the closed-captioned signal with this TV set.

- The video tape which was dubbed
- The weak signal reception
- The nonstandardized signal reception

TEXT

Text is information that is displayed on the lower half of a TV screen. It is not related to the program on the TV screen. For example, it could be a listing of the closed-captioned programs, news, weather information or stock market reports.



TO DISPLAY TEXT INFORMATION

1 Press FUNCTION until "C. CAPT" is displayed on the screen in red.

2 Press Function ▲ or ▼ until "TEXT 1" or "TEXT 2" is displayed on the screen in red.

The TV displays TEXT information automatically if the program you are watching has text added.


If you do not want to display the TEXT information, select "OFF".

Note: If you select a Caption format channel and the "TEXT" mode, the TEXT (black) screen will always be displayed. However, if the TEXT character signal is not transmitted, the characters are not displayed.

This TV receiver provides display of television closed captioning in accordance with 15.119 of the FCC rules.

This TV receiver supports 5 (except Blue and Magenta) of 7 color attributes.

ON-SCREEN DEMONSTRATION



When this function is activated, your TV will automatically display a variety of its on-screen menus and special features. This function is provided for the Toshiba dealer. You may not need to use this function.

1 Press the **FUNCTION** button until "DEMONSTRATION" is displayed on the screen in red.


To operate your TV and VIDEO equipment properly refer to the instructions furnished with the VIDEO equipment.

MAINTENANCE AND CARE

WARNING: TV sets use High Voltages. Do not try to remove the cabinet back. Refer servicing to qualified service personnel.

- To clean the TV screen:
 - 1. First remove the plug from the power outlet.
 - Use a clean cellulose sponge or chamois cloth dampened with a solution of mild detergent and warm water to clean TV screen and trim. Do not use too much water on the TV screen.
- 3. Remove any extra moisture with the same cloth or a dry one.
- To maintain the finish and appearance of the cabinet, polish it from time to time with a quality furniture polish.

Limited One (1) Year Warranty

TACP and THI warrant this product and its parts against defects in materials or workmanship for a period of one (1) year after the date of original retail purchase. During this period, TACP and THI will repair a defective product or part, without charge to you. Service on this product will be made available to you in your home.

Limited Two (2) Year Warranty of Picture Tube

TACP and THI further warrant the picture tube in this product against defects in materials or workmanship for a period of two (2) years after the date of original retail purchase. During this period, TACP and THI will replace a defective picture tube without charge to you, except that if a defective picture tube is replaced after one (1) year from the date of the original retail purchase, you pay labor charges involved in the replacement.
