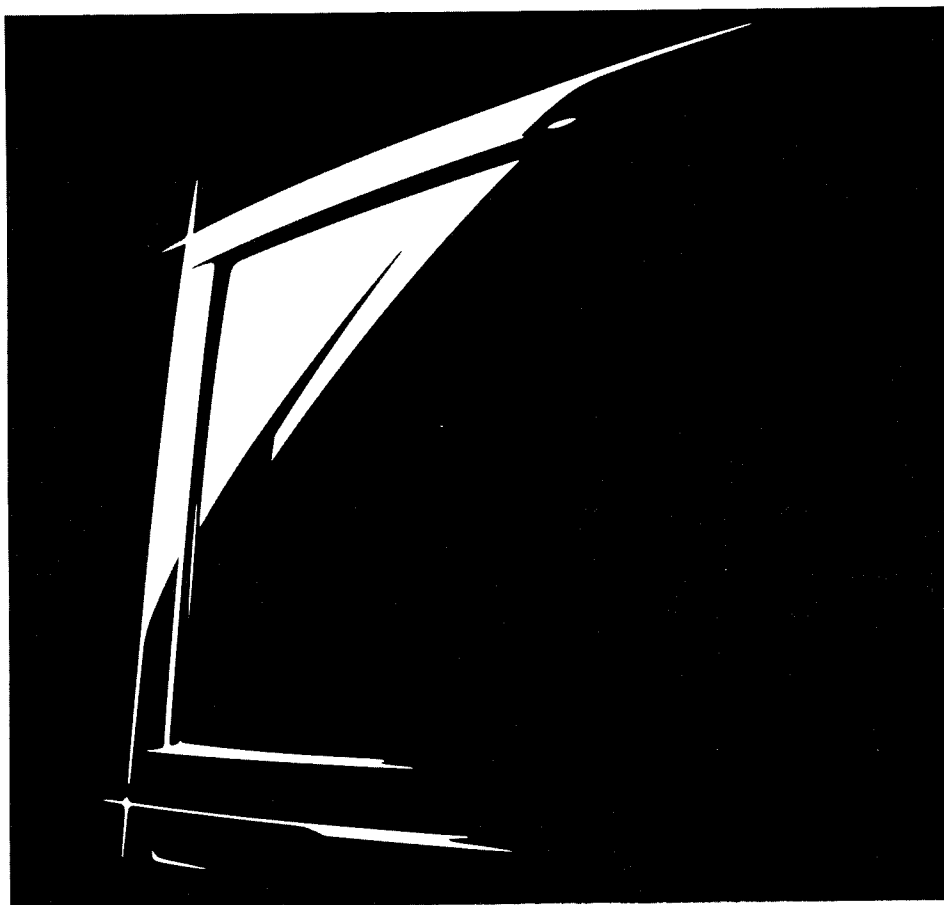

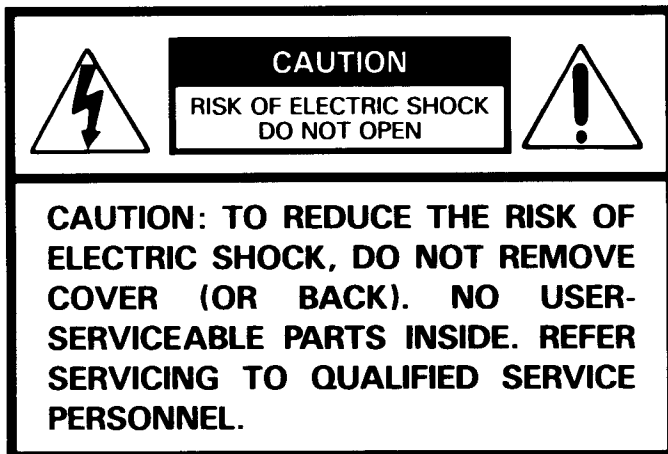

WARNING:

TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE OR ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT EXPOSE THIS APPLIANCE TO RAIN OR MOISTURE.

CAUTION:

TO PREVENT ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT USE THIS POLARIZED PLUG WITH AN EXTENSION CORD RECEPTACLE OR OTHER OUTLET UNLESS THE PRONGS CAN BE FULLY INSERTED INTO THE OUTLET TO PREVENT ANY EXPOSURE OF THE PRONGS ON THE POLARIZED PLUG.



The lightning symbol in the triangle tells you that the voltage inside this product may be strong enough to cause an electric shock. **DO NOT TRY TO SERVICE THIS PRODUCT YOURSELF.**



The exclamation point in the triangle tells you that important operating and maintenance instructions follow this symbol.

Avoid displaying stationary images on your TV screen for extended periods of time. Stationary patterns generated by computer displays, video games, stock market reports etc. can become permanently engrained on the picture tube. This damage is not protected by your warranty as it is the result of misuse. Should you wish to use your TOSHIBA Television to display still images, it is always advisable to reduce brightness and contrast settings. Never leave a video game or computer display unattended.

This TV set may be used only with TOSHIBA stand model ST272. Use with other stands may result in instability causing possible injury.

NOTE TO CATV SYSTEM INSTALLER:

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

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INSTALLING YOUR TV SET

WARNING: Do not place the TV on an uneven floor or on an unstable stand. The set may overturn, causing serious injury to you or your children. Take care that your children do not get on the TV or hang on to it.

DO NOT:

- Place your TV set in a room where direct lighting strikes the screen.
- Place your TV set too close to a wall, in a confined area or in a very warm location.
- Change the plug's safety prong.

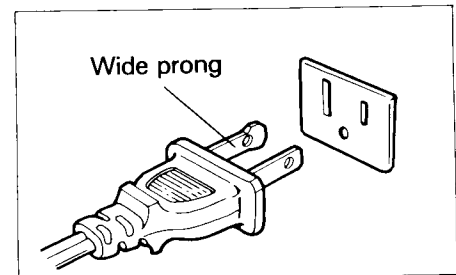
DO:

- Use soft and indirect lighting.
- Sit at least 6 feet away from the set.
- Provide normal air circulation for reliable long life.
- Plug into an electrical outlet with standard house power. (120 volt AC, 60Hz)

CAUTION:

As a safety feature, the plug has one prong wider than the other. It will fit only one way into a standard electrical outlet. If the plug will not fit into the outlet, try turning it around. If the plug will not fit either way, the outlet is probably old and non-standard. You will need to have a new outlet installed by an electrician.

DO NOT CHANGE THE SAFETY FEATURE OF THE PLUG.



ANTENNA/CABLE TV GENERAL INFORMATION

You can use either an indoor or outdoor antenna to receive VHF and/or UHF channels. Channels 2-13 are VHF channels, and channels 14-69 are UHF channels.

We recommend using an outdoor antenna for better picture quality.

You can receive Cable TV by connecting a cable supplied by your local cable company.

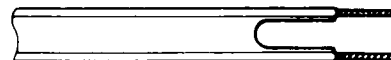
Cable TV delivers both VHF and UHF channels and other channels not available from your antenna.

TYPES OF ANTENNA CABLES

Shown below are two basic types of antenna cables. Signals from a home antenna may be conducted through either type. Cable TV signals will always be conducted through 75 ohm coaxial cable.

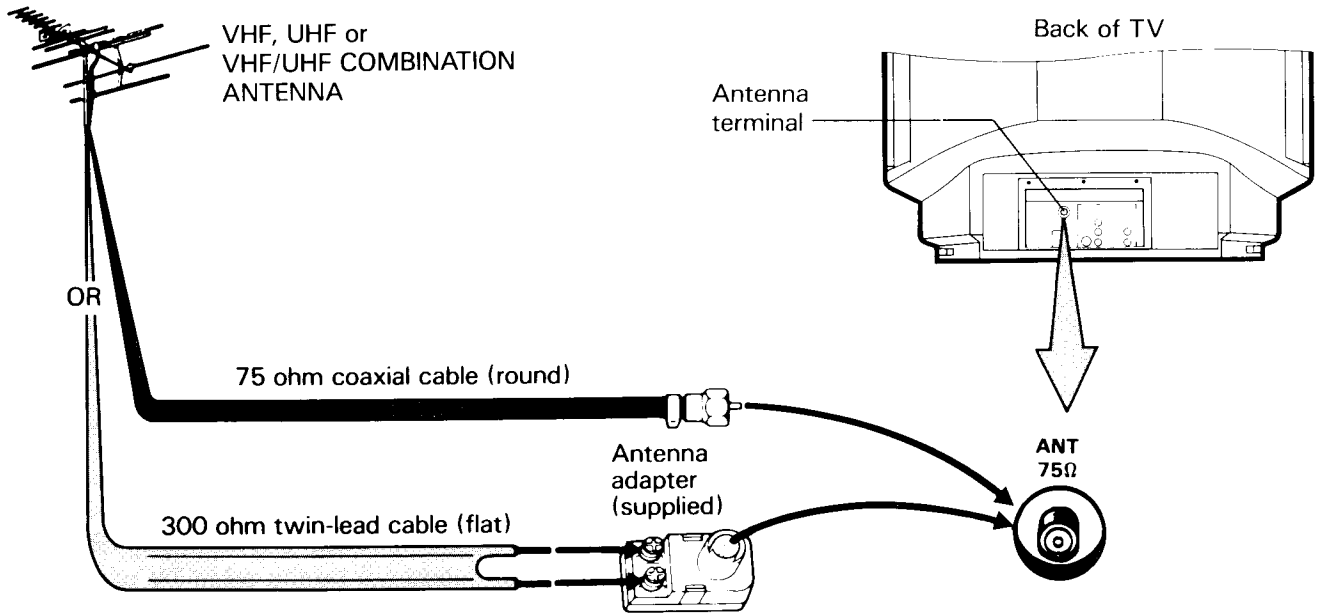
1. A 75 ohm system is generally a round cable with F-type connectors that can easily be attached to a terminal without tools.
2. A 300 ohm system is a flat "twin-lead" cable that can be attached to a terminal through an antenna adapter supplied as an accessory.

Optional F-type connector

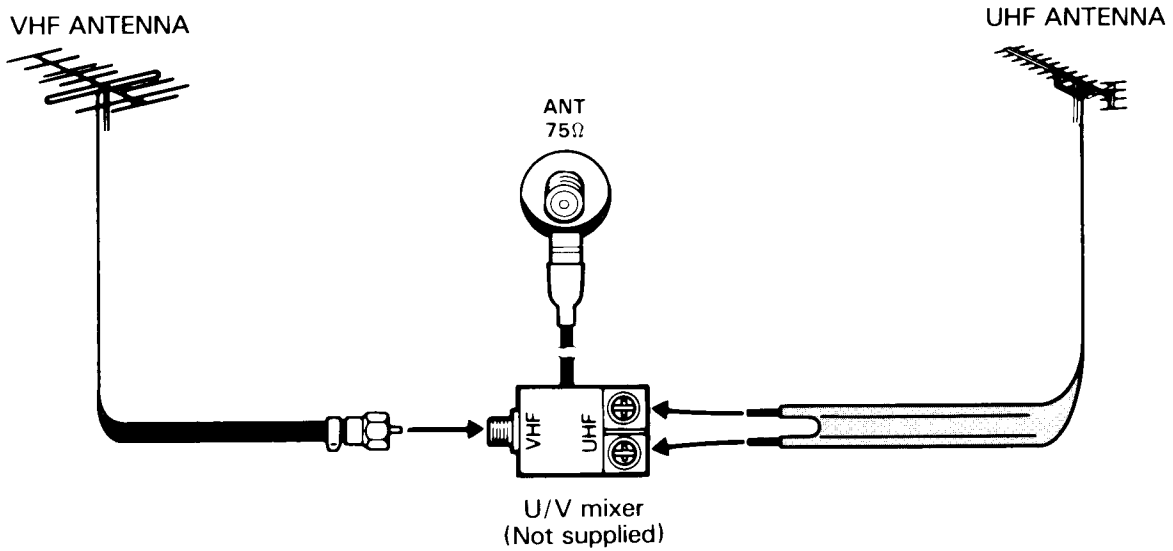


HOME ANTENNA CONNECTION

Connecting a single lead-in cable

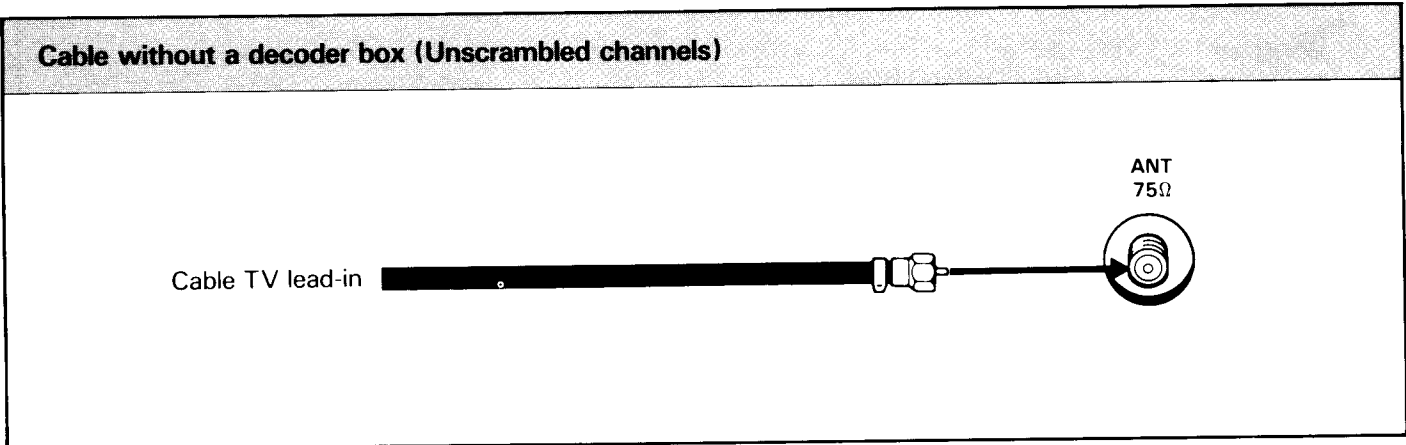


Connecting both VHF and UHF lead-in cables

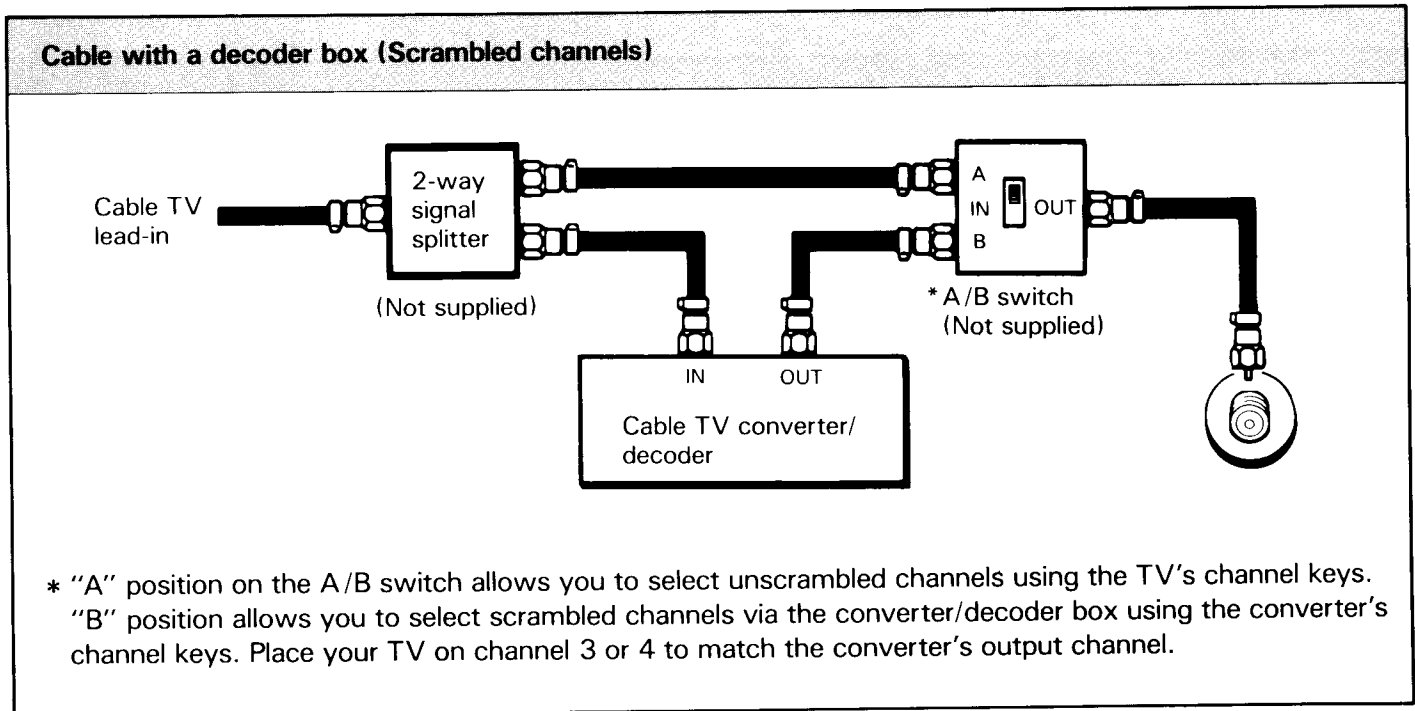


CABLE TV CONNECTION

Generally, the incoming cable for a Cable TV system can be connected directly to the TV antenna terminal just like a home antenna connection. Simply attach it to the ANT (75Ω) terminal. You will be able to receive unscrambled cable channels.



Some cable companies offer "premium pay channels". Since the signals of these premium pay channels are scrambled, a cable TV converter/decoder is generally provided to the subscriber by the cable TV company. This decoder box is necessary for normal viewing of the scrambled channels. For more specific instructions on installing cable TV, consult your cable TV company.

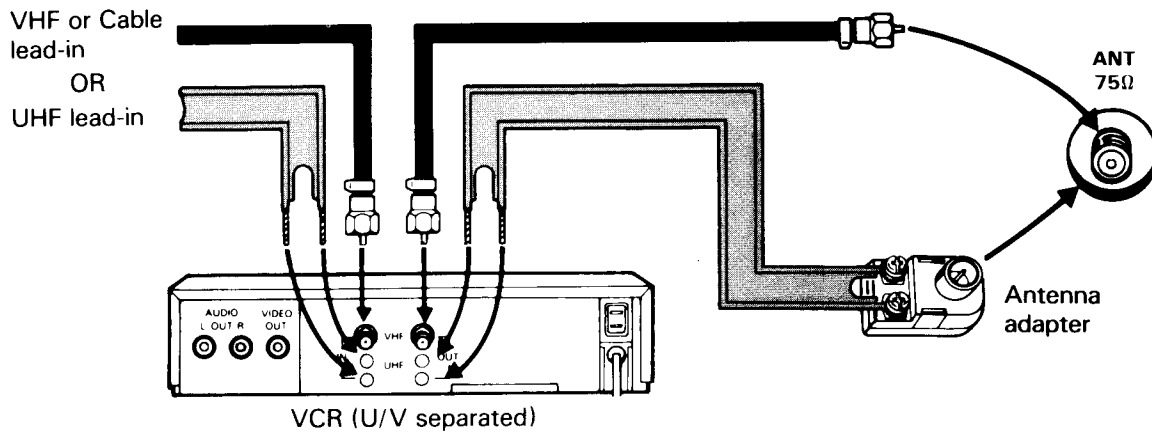


Notes:

- The descrambler device may or may not be a part of the cable converter.
- Since cable systems vary, you may wish to consult your local cable company for additional information.

ANTENNA/CABLE TV AND VCR CONNECTIONS

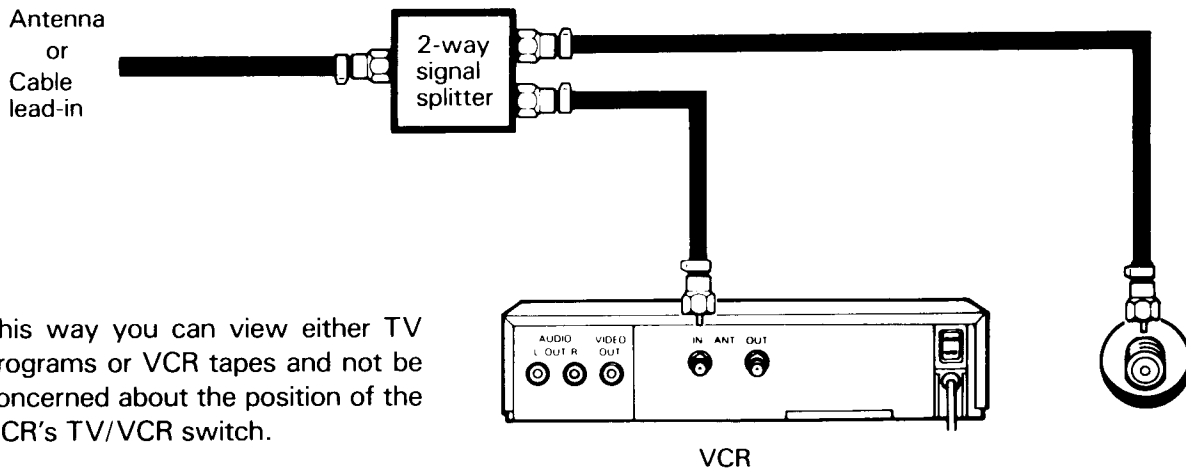
Antenna/Cable connection via VCR (simplified method)



Notes:

- On many VCR's, playback of tapes causes the TV/VCR switching to disconnect the antenna signals from the TV. If you cannot select a certain channel, try pressing the TV/VCR button on the Remote Control.
- If you connect both VHF and UHF lead-in cables, use an optional U/V mixer. See page 5.

Using a 2-way signal splitter

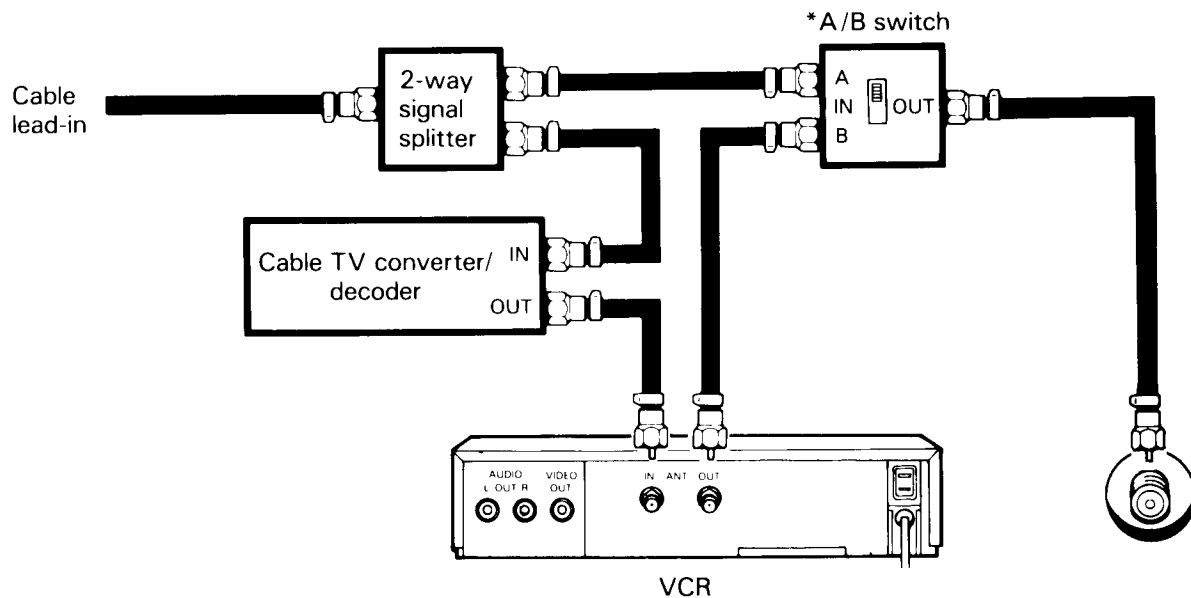


This way you can view either TV programs or VCR tapes and not be concerned about the position of the VCR's TV/VCR switch.

Note: When connected either way, the VIDEO/AUDIO connections from the VCR to the TV are required for PIP (Picture in Picture) viewing and for stereo playback from stereo VCR's. See pages 31 and 39 for connection details.

ANTENNA/CABLE TV AND VCR CONNECTION (Cont.)

Cable with a converter/decoder box (Scrambled channels)



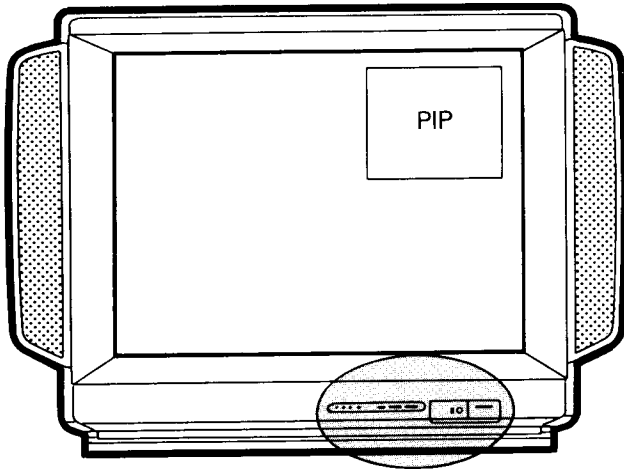
* "A" position on the A/B switch allows you to select unscrambled channels using the TV's channel keys. "B" position on the A/B switch allows you to select scrambled channels via the cable TV converter/decoder using the converter's channel keys. Place your TV and VCR on channel 3 or 4 to match the converter's output channel.

Note: When connected this way, the VIDEO/AUDIO connections from the VCR to the TV are required for PIP (Picture in Picture) viewing and for stereo playback from stereo VCR's. See pages 31 and 39 for connection details.

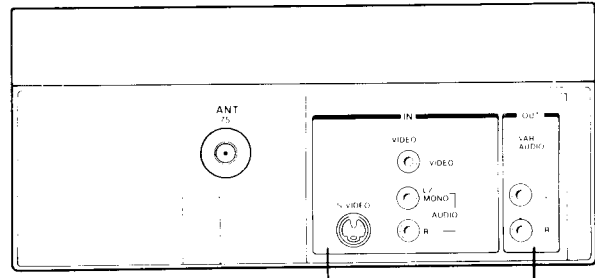

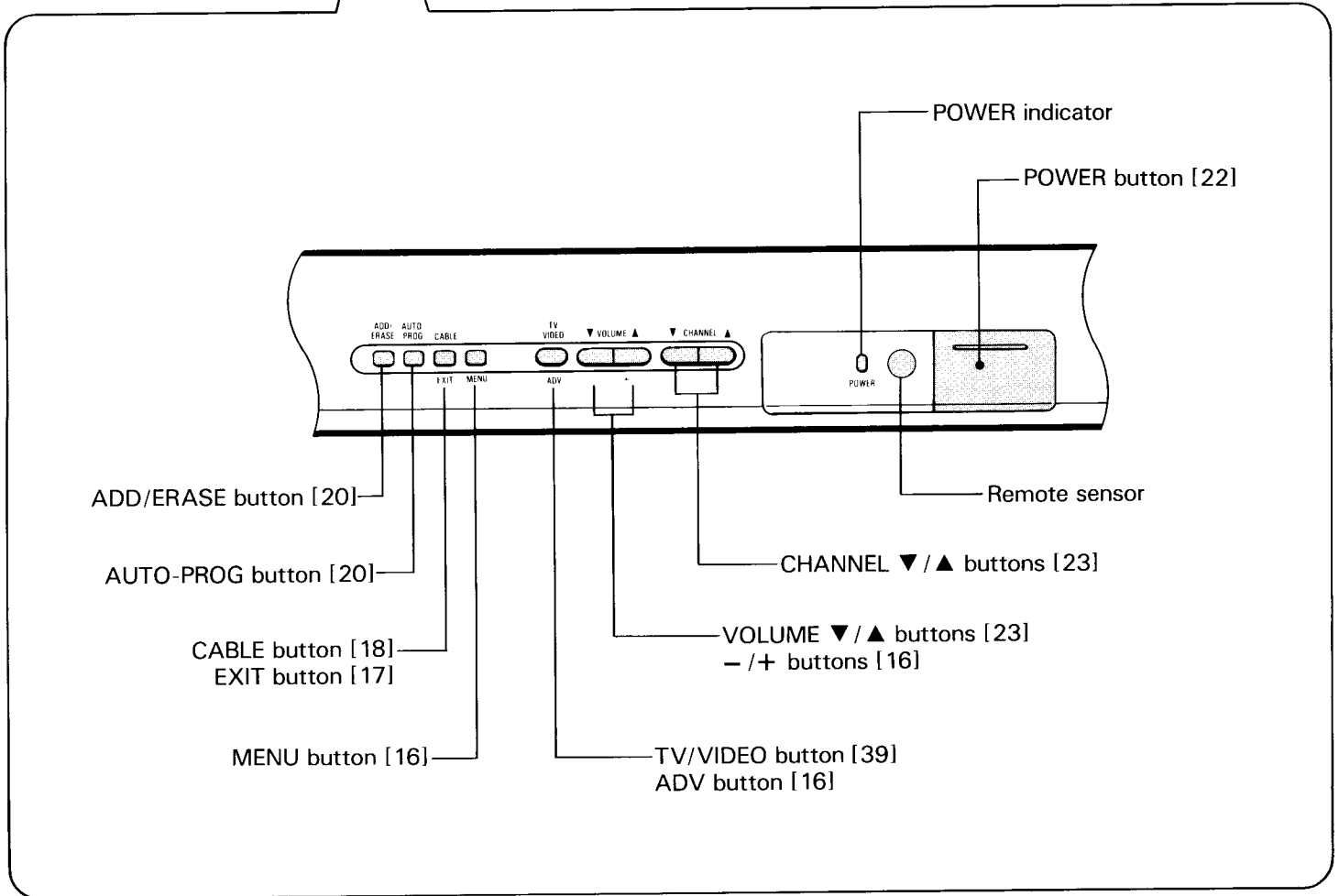
FRONT VIEW



REAR PANEL VIEW



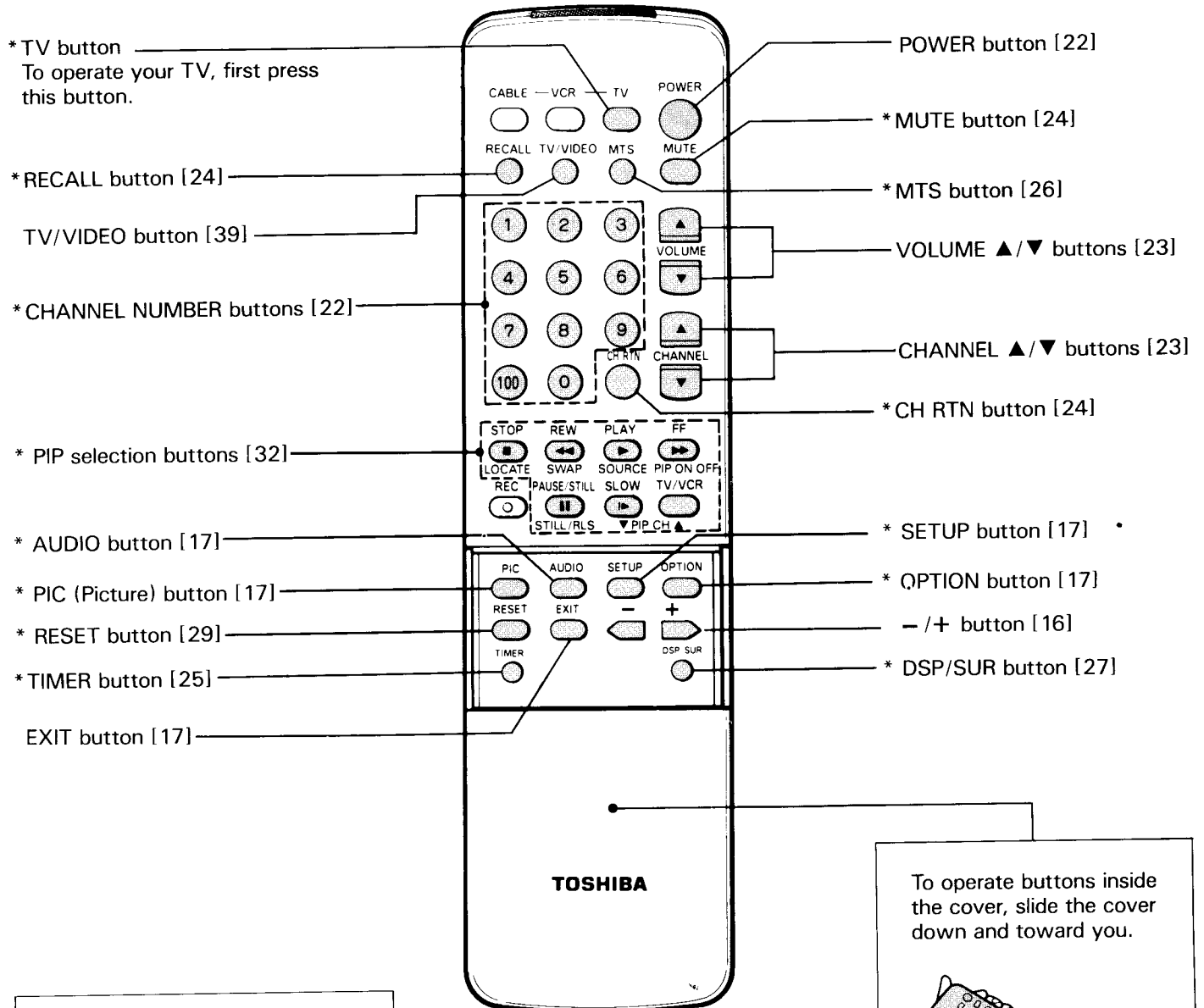
VIDEO/AUDIO terminals [38]



LOCATION OF CONTROLS (Remote Control)

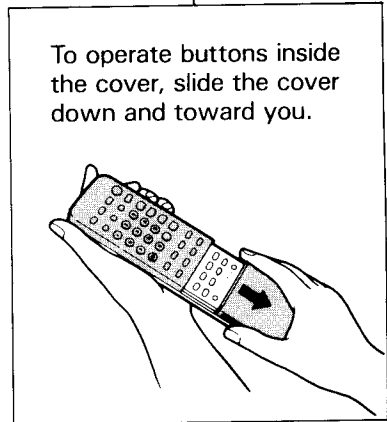

USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

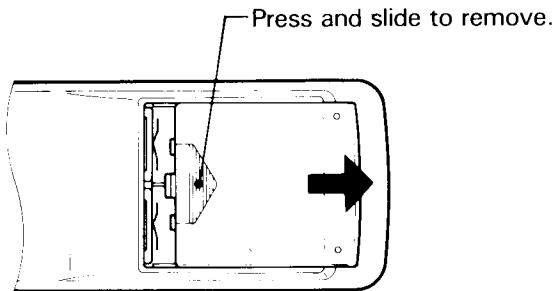
INTRODUCTIONS

This Remote Control allows you to operate your TV set and most models of remote-controlled VCR's and Cable TV Converters even if they are different brands. However, this Remote Control must be programmed to control other brands of VCR's and/or Converters. If you will be using your TV set with a TOSHIBA VCR, your remote has already been preprogrammed for you.

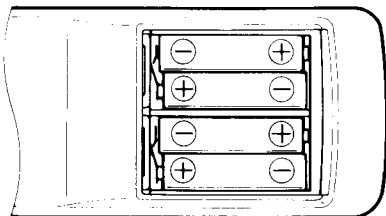
- Before attempting to operate your Remote Control, install the batteries according to the section "INSTALLING AND REPLACING BATTERIES" shown below.
- For more detailed instructions, see the section "PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL" on page 14.

INSTALLING AND REPLACING BATTERIES

1. Place the Remote Control with the face down. Push down on the ridged area of the battery cover and slide it off.



2. Place the four "AAA" size batteries, matching the + and - signs on each battery to the + and - signs of the battery compartment.



3. Replace the battery cover until the lock snaps.

Note:

- After installing new batteries, the Remote Control will set itself to codes for TOSHIBA's TV and VCR. If you are using the Remote Control to operate equipment that uses different codes, it will have to be reprogrammed for those codes.
- This Remote Control may have functions not available on the original remote control. These functions may or may not operate your VCR or Cable TV Converter. Refer to the owner's manuals supplied with the equipments to see which functions are available.
- The remote control supplied with your VCR or Cable TV Converter may have keys not duplicated on this Remote Control. If these functions are desired, the original remote will have to be used.

TIPS FOR BEST OPERATION

- For optimum performance, aim the Remote Control directly at the equipment it is being used to operate and be sure there is no obstruction between the Remote Control and the equipment.
- If your Remote Control does not always adjust the set as you wish, you probably need to replace the batteries. See the directions at the left.
- Remove dead batteries immediately to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.
- If you do not intend to use the Remote Control for a long period, remove the batteries.

CAUTION:

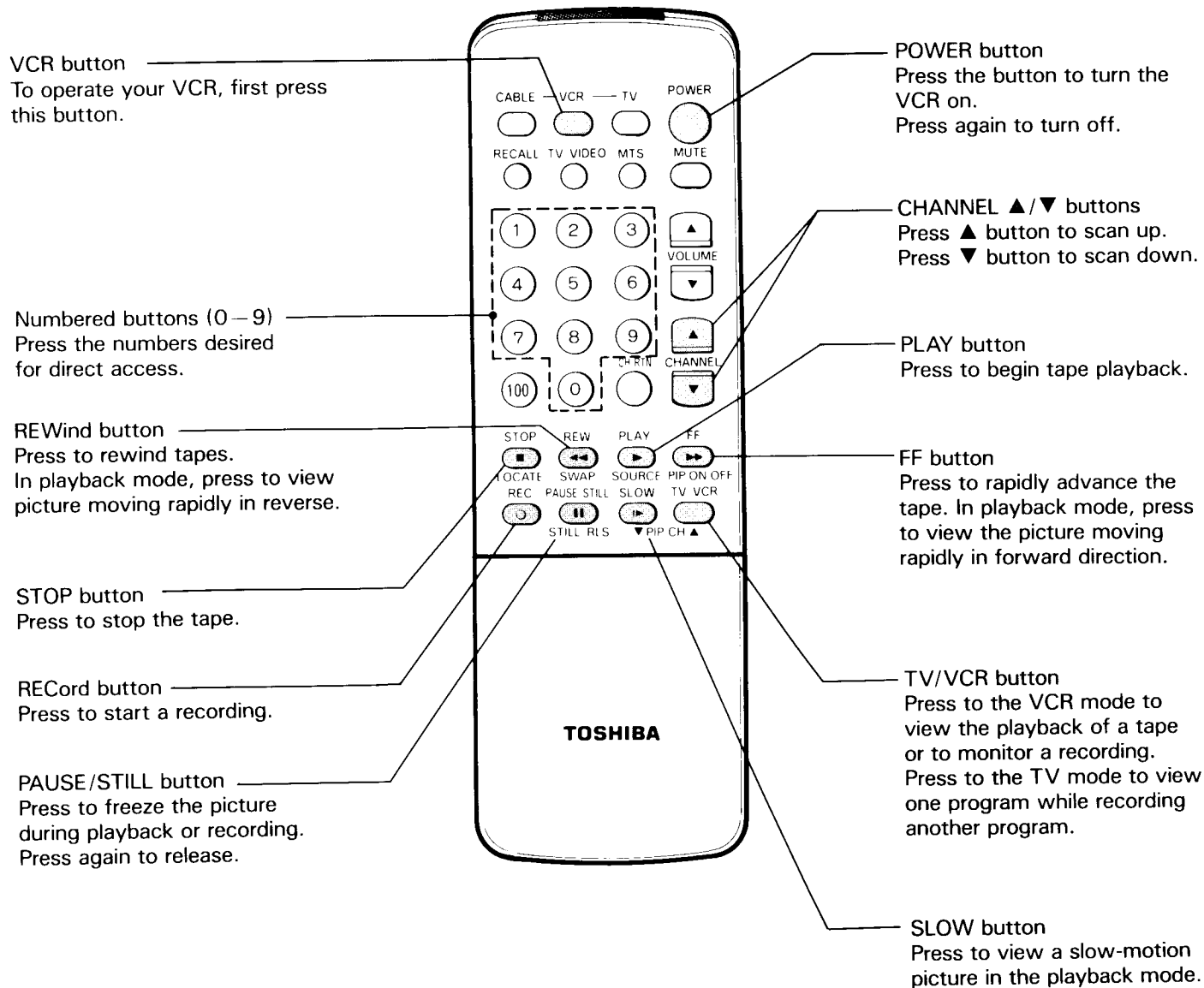
- Do not throw your batteries into a fire. Dispose of your batteries in a designated disposal area.
- Do not combine used old batteries with new ones.
- Do not mix battery types.

USING THE REMOTE CONTROL (Continued)

USING THE REMOTE WITH VCR

- To control a TOSHIBA VCR, first press the VCR button to put the Remote in the "VCR mode". The buttons shown below will then control the VCR.
- If you have another brand of VCR, you can probably program your Remote to control it. Details are on page 14.

Aim at the VCR

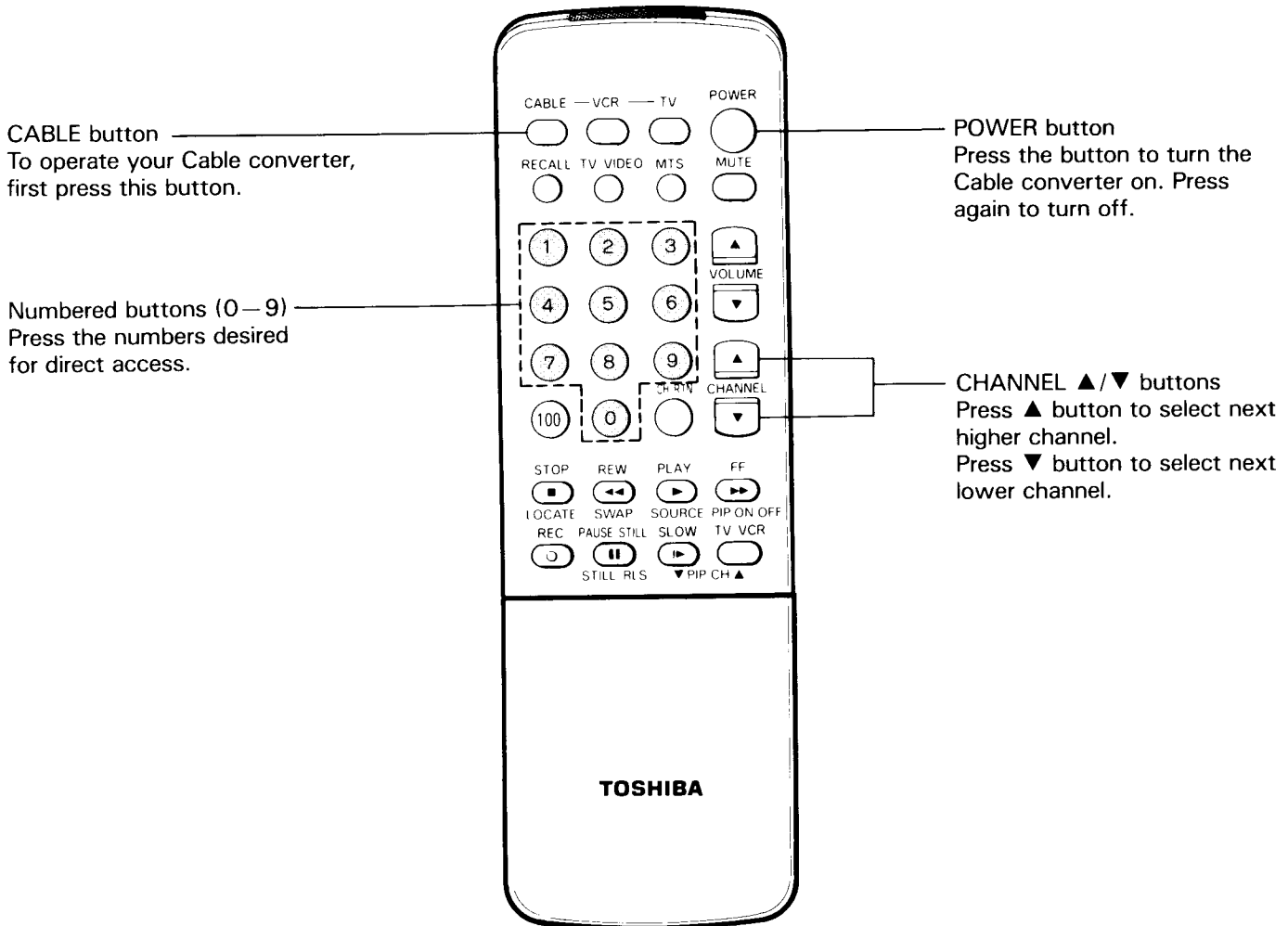


Note: The VOLUME ▲/▼ and MUTE buttons always control the TV set regardless of the CABLE, VCR or TV button position. When using these buttons, aim the Remote Control at the TV set.

USING THE REMOTE WITH CABLE TV CONVERTER

- To control a Cable TV converter, first press the CABLE button to put the Remote in the "CABLE mode".
- This Remote Control is designed to control several brands of Cable TV converter. If this Remote does not control your converter, you can probably also program your Remote to control it. Details are on page 14.

Aim at the Cable TV Converter



Note: The VOLUME ▲/▼ and MUTE buttons always control the TV set regardless of the CABLE, VCR or TV button position. When using these buttons, aim the Remote Control at the TV set. If your Cable TV converter has a volume control, adjust it for maximum volume level. Then adjust the volume using the VOLUME ▲/▼ buttons on this Remote.

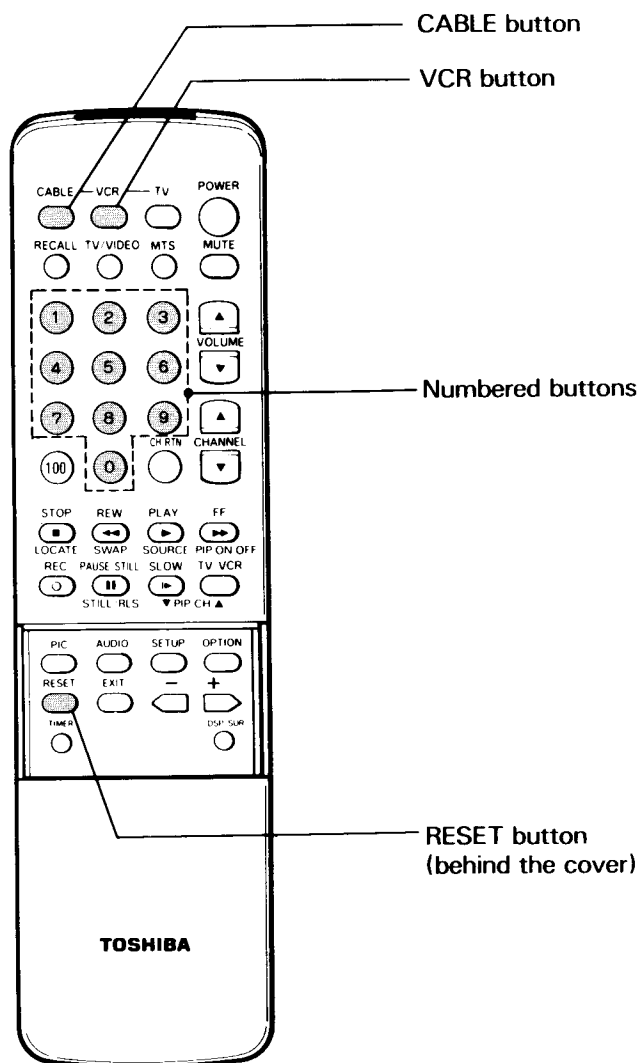

PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL

TO CONTROL OTHER BRANDS OF VCR'S AND CABLE TV CONVERTERS

Before using this Remote Control, it must be programmed to recognize the brands of the VCR and Cable TV Converter box it will be used to operate. If you are using a TOSHIBA [VHS] VCR, it has already been programmed for you. Otherwise, follow the steps below.



TO CONTROL YOUR VCR

- 1 Refer to the "VCR CODE TABLE" on the next page to find the code number that corresponds to the brand name of your VCR. Keep this number in mind. If more than one number is listed, you may need to try each one separately until you find the one that works.
- 2 Press the VCR button.
- 3 Press the RESET button.
- 4 Press two number buttons (within three seconds of pressing the RESET button) to enter the code number for your brand of VCR.
- 5 Point the Remote at the VCR and press the POWER button to test the code number.
 - If the right number was entered, the VCR should turn on.
 - If the VCR does not respond to the Remote Control, repeat steps 1 thru 5 with another code number.

TO CONTROL YOUR CABLE TV CONVERTER

- 1 Refer to the "CABLE TV CONVERTER CODE TABLE" on the next page to find the code number that corresponds to the brand name of your converter.
 - 2 Press the CABLE button.
 - 3 Press the RESET button.
 - 4 Press two number buttons (within three seconds of pressing the RESET button) to enter the code number for your brand of converter.
 - 5 Point the Remote at the converter and press the POWER button to test the code number. If the converter does not respond to the Remote Control repeat steps 1 thru 5 with another code number.
- Note:** You may have to reprogram the Remote Control if you change its batteries.

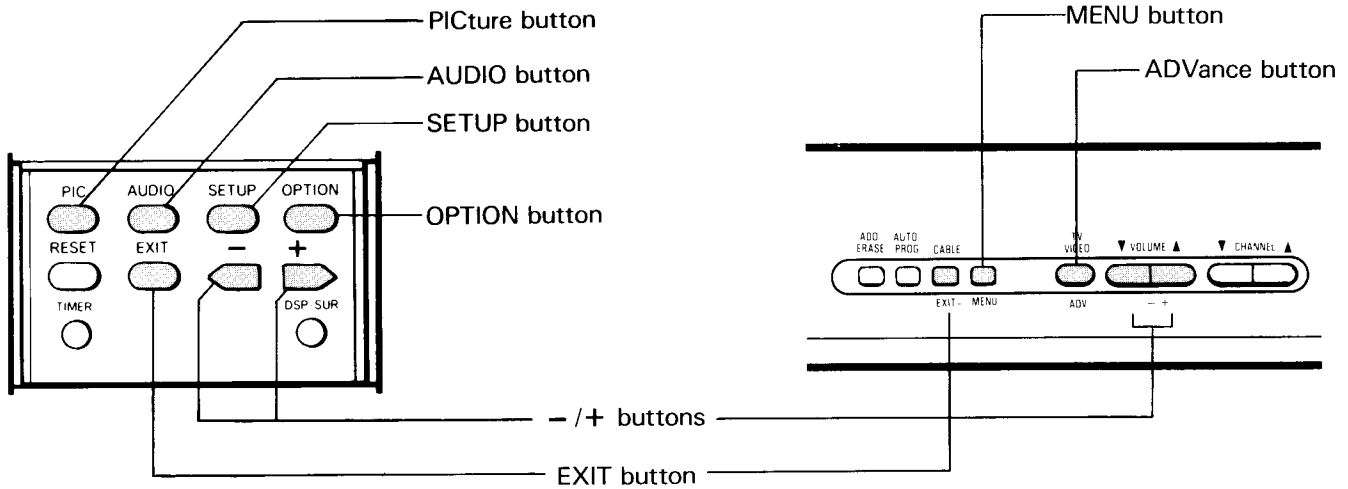

Programming the Remote Control

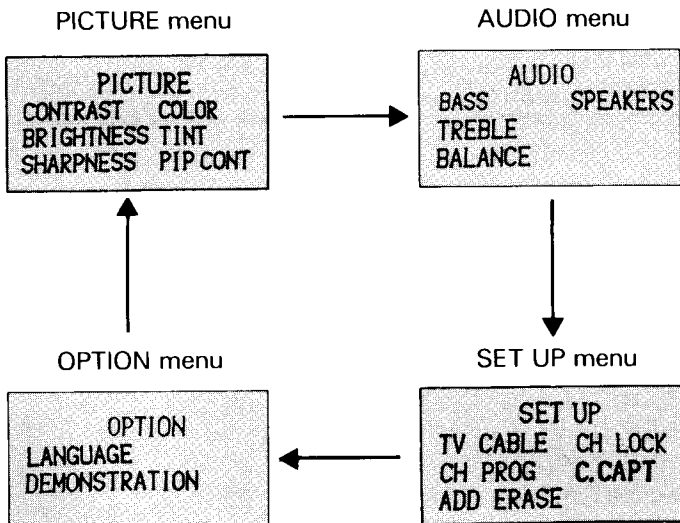
MENU FUNCTION (General Instructions)

We suggest you familiarize yourself with the procedure before using the Menu function. To adjust any TV feature, the use of the Menu function is required. The adjustments that can be made to the TV appear on the screen.



MENU BUTTON (on TV)

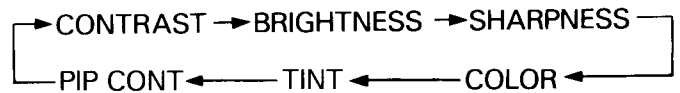
Each time you press the button, the PICTURE, AUDIO, SET UP or OPTION menu on-screen display is selected in the following order, then press the ADV button.



ADV BUTTON (on TV)

Use this button after you have pressed the MENU button to select the function you want to adjust. Each time you press the button, the function to be adjusted will be selected in the following order.

<Example: PICTURE menu>

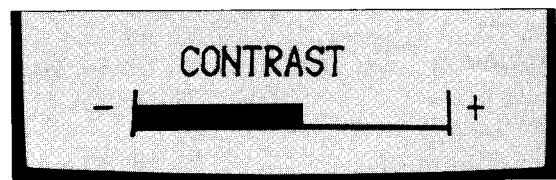


The selected function will be displayed in magenta.

- / + BUTTONS (on TV and on Remote)

Use these buttons after you have pressed the ADV button or any of the four menu buttons (PICTURE, AUDIO, SETUP, or OPTION).

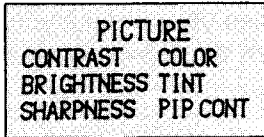
<Example: CONTRAST adjustment mode display>



Decrease (- button) ← → Increase (+ button)

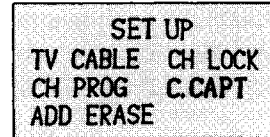
PIC (Picture) BUTTON (on Remote)

Press the button repeatedly until the PICTURE menu function you want to adjust is selected. The selected function will be displayed in magenta. Then press the + or - button to adjust the setting. Details for each function begin on page 28.



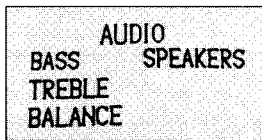
SETUP BUTTON (on Remote)

Press the button repeatedly until the SET UP menu function you want to adjust is selected. The selected function will be displayed in magenta. Then press the + or - button to adjust the setting. Details for each function begin on page 18.



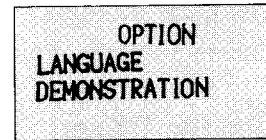
AUDIO BUTTON (on Remote)

Press the button repeatedly until the AUDIO menu function you want to adjust is selected. The selected function will be displayed in magenta. Then press the + or - button to adjust the setting. Details for each function begin on page 30.



OPTION BUTTON (on Remote)

Press the button repeatedly until the OPTION menu function you want to adjust is selected. The selected function will be displayed in magenta. Then press the + or - button to adjust the setting. Details for each function begin on page 37.



EXIT BUTTON (on TV and on Remote)

The above four menu displays will automatically disappear from the screen if no control has been operated for about 15 seconds, and all other menu displays also disappear after about 6 seconds. If you want to clear the screen of all on-screen displays instantly, press this button.

Notes:

- The ADV button on the TV set will function as the TV/VIDEO button when no menu display is on the screen.
- The + / - buttons on the TV set will function as the VOLUME ▲ / ▼ buttons when no menu display is on the screen.

TV CHANNELS

This TV will receive the following TV signals:

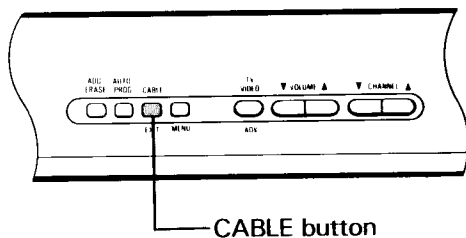
1. TV: Off the air TV signals. (VHF channels 2 thru 13 and UHF channels 14 thru 69)
2. STD CABLE: Standard (or IRC: Incremental Related Carrier) cable TV signals.
3. HRC CABLE: Harmonic Related Carrier cable TV signals.
4. IRC CABLE: Incremental Related Carrier cable TV signals.

For each of these systems, your TV set has exact frequencies built into it to ensure precise tuning. For precise tuning, the CABLE button must be set to match your TV or CABLE system. The chart on the next page shows channels available in each system and how your TV displays them. When you connect your TV to a cable TV system and if you are not sure what system they are using, proceed with the following section "HOW TO FIND YOUR TYPE OF CABLE SYSTEM" or consult your local cable company.

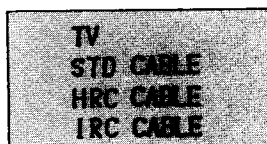
HOW TO FIND YOUR TYPE OF CABLE SYSTEM

- 1 Select the "STD CABLE" mode following the instructions shown below.
 - 2 Select various channels and confirm whether the channel will lock immediately with perfect picture. If the channels seem to take a few seconds to lock in, your cable system may be one of the other cable systems.
- In this case, continue with the following steps.
- 3 Select the "HRC CABLE" mode and try above procedure again.
 - 4 If you are having problem with only channel 5 or 6, you may have an IRC system so change the mode to the "IRC CABLE".

CABLE BUTTON (on the TV set)



Each time you press the button, the "TV", "STD CABLE", "HRC CABLE" or "IRC CABLE" mode will be selected in order.

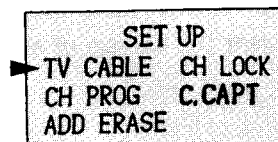


Press the button until the mode that corresponds to your TV or CABLE system is displayed in magenta.

You can also perform this function using the SET UP menu function. See the right column.

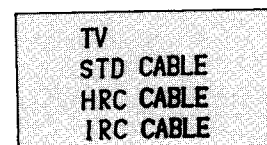
USING THE SET UP MENU FUNCTION

- 1 Press the SETUP button on the Remote Control or the MENU button on the TV set to display the SET UP menu on the screen shown below.



Repeatedly press the SETUP button on the Remote Control or the ADV button on the TV set until "TV CABLE" is displayed in magenta.

- 2 Press either the + or - button until the mode that corresponds to your TV or CABLE system is displayed in magenta.

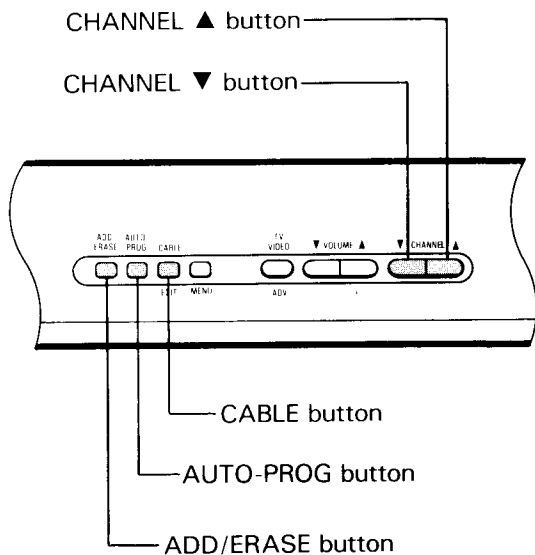
TV channels

Note: The above chart is typical of many cable system channel allocations. However the numbering system may differ in your area. If in doubt, consult your local cable company.

PROGRAMMING CHANNEL MEMORY

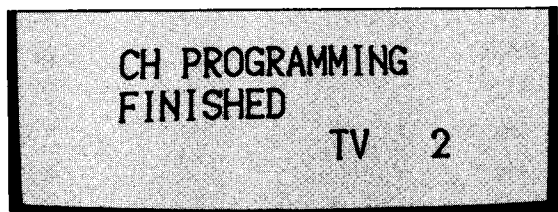
This TV set can memorize channels you use and erase channels you do not use.

When the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button is pressed, the TV goes to the next memorized channel. Channel selection is easier and faster. In many television viewing areas, programming available channels into memory is an easy one step procedure with the AUTO-PROG button on the TV set. When it is decided that certain channels should be erased from the channel scan memory, the ADD/ERASE button provides complete programming flexibility.



Autoprogramming channels

- 1 Turn the TV set on and make sure the CABLE button (page 18) is properly set.
- 2 Press the AUTO-PROG button to start autoprogramming. The TV will automatically cycle through all channels and place active channels in the channel memory. When the following message appears on the screen, the autoprogram is complete.



You can check to see which channels are in memory by pressing the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons.

Note: If AC power supply is cut off for a few seconds or more, your autoprogramming will be cancelled and will return to the original factory programming. In that case, reautoprogram your TV.

Erasing channels you do not use

If you want to erase any of the memorized channels:

- 1 Press either the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button until an undesired channel is tuned.
- 2 Press the ADD/ERASE button once. The words "CH ERASE" are displayed on the screen in magenta for about 6 seconds indicating that the channel has been erased from the memory.



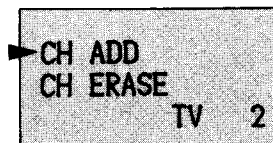
The Added mode and Erased mode alternate whenever the ADD/ERASE button is pressed.

- 3 Repeat steps 1 and 2 until all undesired channels have been erased from the memory.

Adding channels

You may want to memorize again the channel which has been erased once.

- 1 Using the CHANNEL NUMBER buttons on the Remote Control, select the channel you want to memorize.
- 2 Press the ADD/ERASE button once. The words "CH ADD" are displayed on the screen in magenta indicating that the channel has been memorized.



- 3 Repeat steps 1 and 2 for other channels. Press the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button to make sure the channels are programmed correctly.

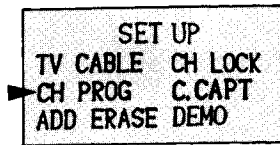
You have now completed the channel programming.

You can also perform these functions using the SET UP menu function.

CH PROG FUNCTION

- 1 Press the SETUP button on the Remote Control or MENU button on the TV set to display the SET UP menu on the screen.

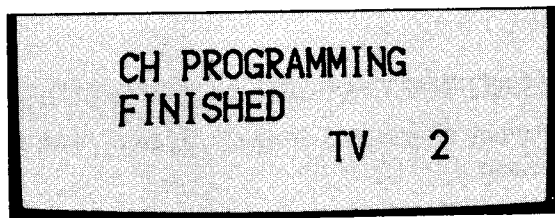
Repeatedly press the SETUP button on the Remote Control or the ADV button on the TV set until "CH PROG" is displayed in magenta.



- 2 Press either the + or - button to start autoprogramming.

The TV will automatically cycle through all channels and place active channels in the channel memory.

When the following message appears on the screen, the autoprogram is complete.



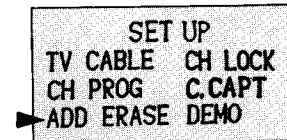
You can check to see which channels are in memory by pressing the CHANNEL ▼/▲ buttons.

ADD ERASE FUNCTION

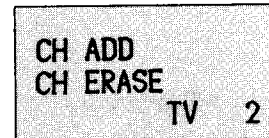
First follow the instructions "CH PROG FUNCTION", and then add or erase individual channels as desired.

Erasing/Adding channels

- 1 Select the channel you want to erase using the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button, or select the channel you want to add using the CHANNEL NUMBER buttons.
- 2 Select the SET UP menu, and repeatedly press the SETUP button on the Remote Control or the ADV button on the TV set until "ADD ERASE" is displayed in magenta.



- 3 Press either the + or - button: To erase the channel, press the button until "CH ERASE" is displayed in magenta. To add the channel, press the button until "CH ADD" is displayed in magenta.



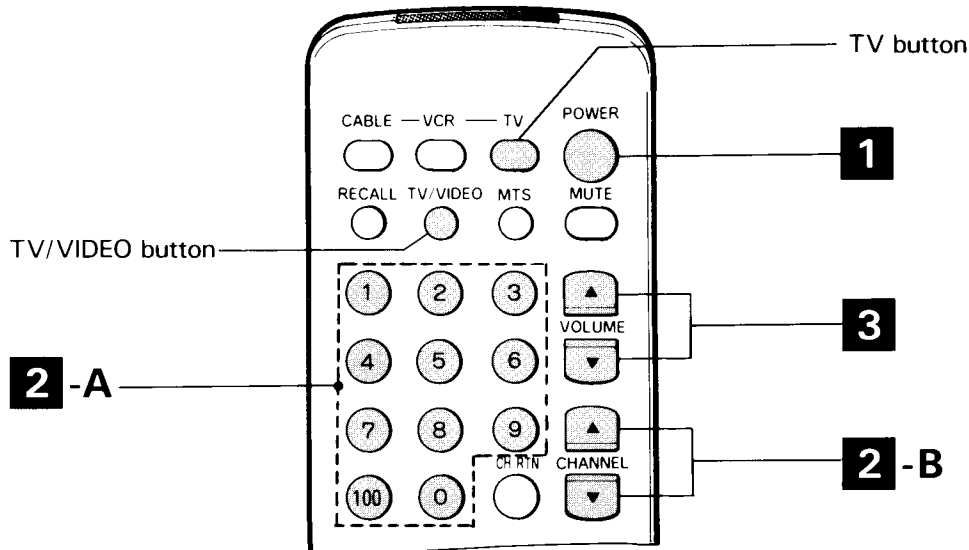
- 4 Repeat steps 1 through 3 for other channels. Press the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button to make sure the channels are programmed correctly.

Note: The ADV button on the TV set will function only when any of the menu displays is on the screen.

WATCHING TV PROGRAMS

Generally, the Remote Control is all that is required to operate the TV set.

- First press the TV button on the Remote Control.

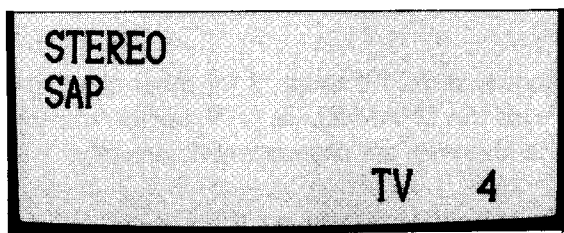


1 TO TURN THE TV SET ON

Press the POWER button to turn the TV set on. The following on-screen information will be displayed for a few seconds.

- Channel number or VIDEO mode selected.
- Stereo or SAP audio status.

< Example >



To turn the TV set off, press the button again.

Note: The TV/VIDEO button is used to view the signals coming from other devices like VCR's or Video Disc Players connected to this TV. Details are on page 39.

2 TO SELECT CHANNELS

Make sure the CABLE button (page 18) is properly set. Then select your desired channels using the CHANNEL NUMBER buttons or the CHANNEL ▲ / ▼ buttons.

A. USING THE CHANNEL NUMBER BUTTONS

- To select channels 1 through 9, two methods are available.

Example: To select channel 4.

One-digit entry – Press "4". Channel 4 will be selected within 2 seconds.

Two-digit entry – Press "0" and "4". Channel 4 will be selected immediately.

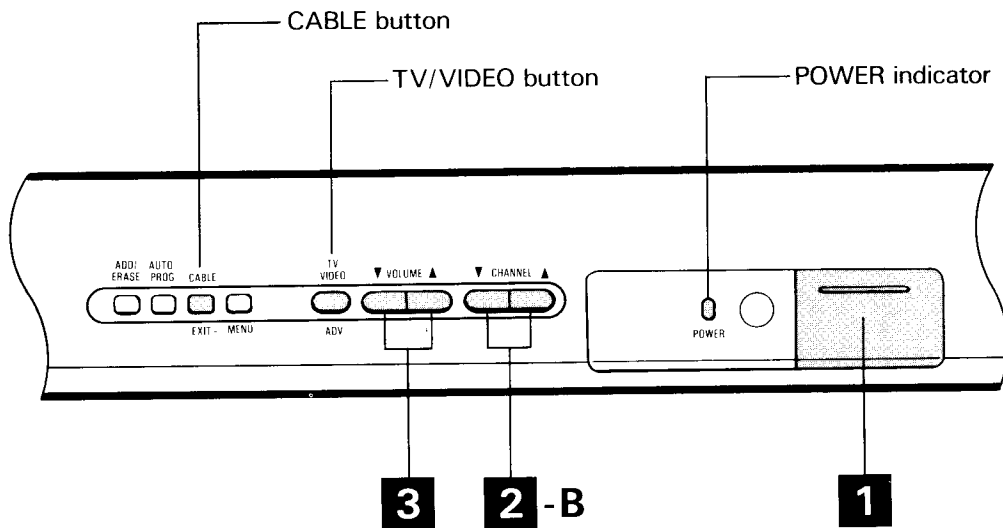
- To select channels 10 through 99, the two-digit entry must be used.

Example: To select channel 38.

Press "3" and "8", and channel 38 will be selected immediately.

- To select channels 100 through 125, the three-digit entry must be used.

Example: Press "100", "2" and "5" in sequence. Channel 125 will be selected.



B. USING THE CHANNEL ▲/▼ BUTTONS

When you have completed channel programming according to the instructions, use the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons.

Follow the section "PROGRAMMING CHANNEL MEMORY" on page 20.

Press and release the CHANNEL ▲ or ▼ button. The set will select the next memorized channel. It will not stop at unmemorized channels. Press the button again to select the next memorized channel.

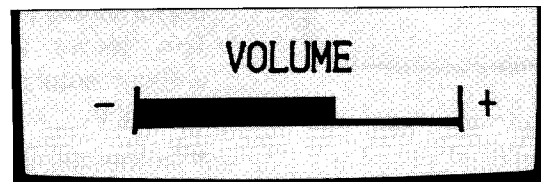

3 TO ADJUST VOLUME

To increase volume, press the VOLUME ▲ button. To decrease volume, press the VOLUME ▼ button. Press and hold either button until your desired volume level is obtained.

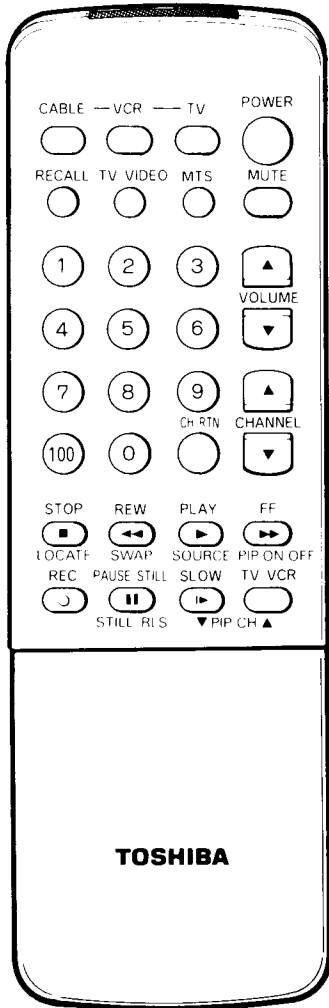

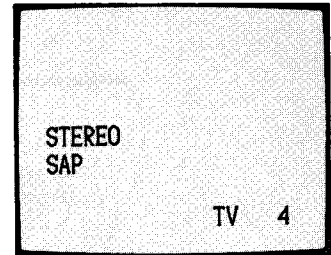

CALLING UP THE ON-SCREEN INFORMATION

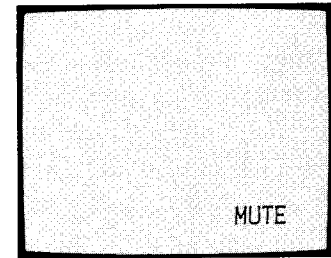
To display the channel number or video mode "VIDEO", and stereo or SAP audio status on the screen for a few seconds, press the RECALL button.



MUTING THE SOUND

To mute the sound immediately without affecting the picture, press the MUTE button. The word "MUTE" will be displayed on the screen as shown. This is useful during telephone calls or other interruptions.

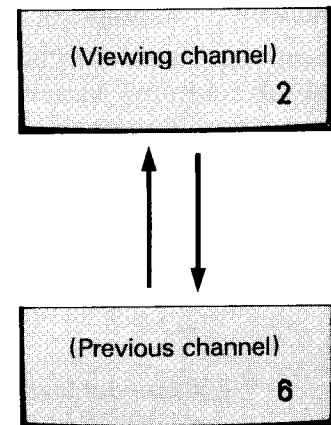
To restore the sound, press the button again.



CHANGING QUICKLY BETWEEN TWO CHANNELS

To return to the last channel that was tuned previously, press the CH RTN button. This is useful should you want to view two channels. This allows you to view two programs without entering the actual channel number each time.

- To operate, select the first channel you want to view. Then select the other channel with the CHANNEL NUMBER buttons.
- The TV will now change back and forth between the two channels each time you press the CH RTN button.

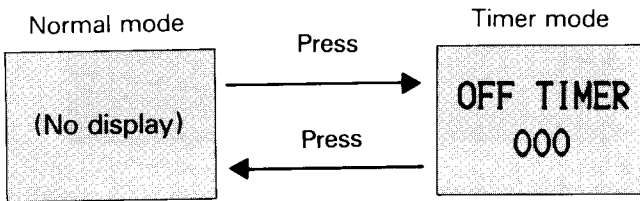


SETTING THE OFF-TIMER (SLEEP)

This feature allows you to set the TV to turn itself off automatically after a certain period of time (every 10 minutes, up to 180 minutes = 3 hours). This is useful whenever you want to watch TV for an hour or so before going to sleep.

TIMER BUTTON

Each time you press the button, the Normal mode and Timer mode will alternate as shown below.



TO SET THE OFF-TIMER

Example: To set the off-timer to turn the TV set off after 120 minutes.

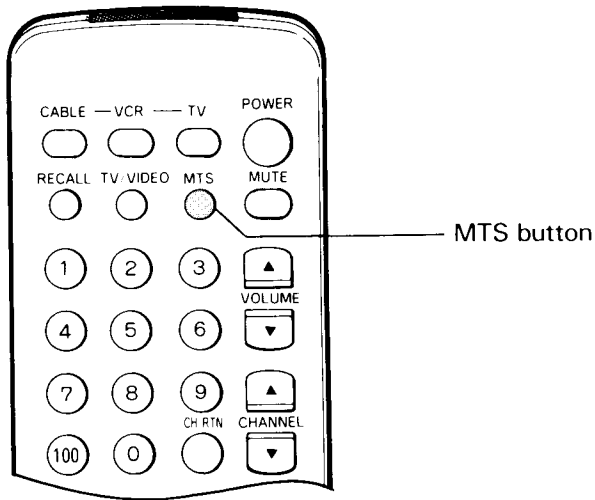
ON-SCREEN DISPLAY	PROCEDURE
00	1. Press the TIMER button to select the Timer mode.
10	2. Press "1" button.
120	3. Press "2" button, and press TIMER button to start the timer. The color of display changes from magenta to cyan, and then goes off.
Setting completed.	

Notes:

- If you press the POWER button while the timer is operating, the timer setting will be cancelled.
- If you want to know the time remaining, press the TIMER button. Remaining time will be displayed on the screen. To erase the display, press the button again to set to the Normal mode.
- You cannot select channels with the Remote Control if the timer display is on the screen.
- If a vacant channel is tuned or TV broadcast for a day is finished, the TV will automatically turn off after about 15 minutes. However, if the Off-timer is operating, it takes precedence. This **Auto-Power-Off** feature does not operate in the VIDEO mode.

RECEIVING STEREO/SAP BROADCASTS

The Multi-channel TV Sound or MTS feature on this TV allows you to improve your TV viewing with high fidelity stereo sound. MTS also provides for an extra channel called Second Audio Program or SAP, used to transmit a second language for bilingual transmission or other sound.



MTS BUTTON

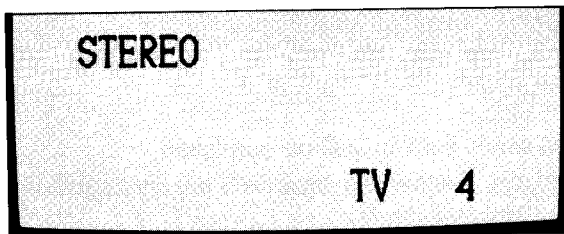
Each time you press the button, the STEREO, SAP, or MONAURAL mode will be selected in order. The usable selections will be displayed in yellow. The selected mode will be displayed in magenta.



Select the appropriate mode according to various incoming broadcast signals.

LISTENING TO STEREO SOUND

When the TV receives a stereo broadcast, the word "STEREO" is displayed on the screen whenever the TV is turned on, the channel is selected or the RECALL button is pressed.



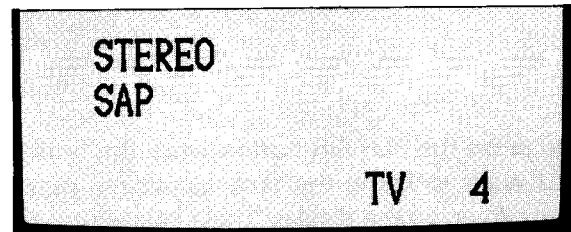
You can then listen to the stereo sound by pressing the MTS button. Select "STEREO".

If a broadcasting signal is not strong enough and noise-free stereo sound is not available, select the MONAURAL mode by pressing the MTS button to receive monaural sound. The noise should stop.

Normally this function can be left in the STEREO mode. Your TV will then automatically reproduce either stereo or monaural sound, whichever is broadcast.

LISTENING TO SECOND LANGUAGE

When the TV receives a SAP broadcast, the word "SAP" is displayed on the screen.



You can then listen to the second language by pressing the MTS button. Select "SAP".

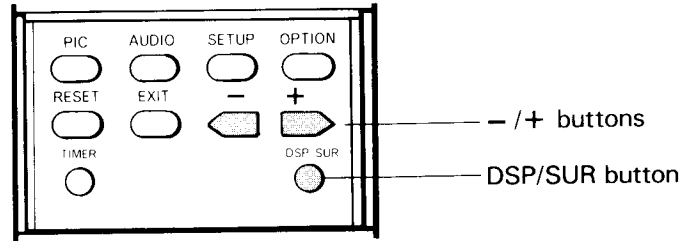
Notes:

- Please be sure you have selected the Stereo mode if broadcast is in stereo.
- If the word "STEREO" (or "SAP") is not displayed on the screen in spite of a known MTS broadcast, select the STEREO or SAP mode by pressing the MTS button again.
- The MTS button does not function in the VIDEO mode.

OPERATING SURROUND FUNCTION

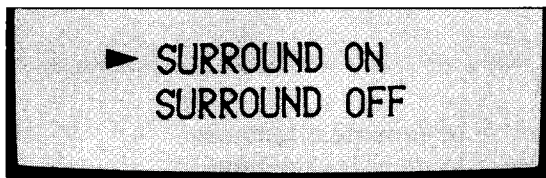
The Surround function expands the audio listening field wider and deeper than you would believe possible from a TV's speakers. This function processes stereo signals from a TV broadcast or Video input. If a TV program is broadcast in monaural, your TV will automatically reproduce monaural audio.

TO ACTIVATE SURROUND

- 1 Select the STEREO mode by pressing the MTS button.
- 2 Press the DSP/SUR button on the Remote Control to call up the Surround ON/OFF mode on-screen display shown below.



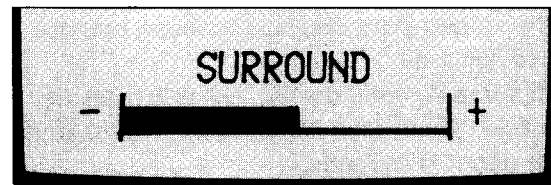
Each time you press the button, "ON" mode and "OFF" mode will alternate. Press the button until "SURROUND ON" is displayed in magenta. The Surround function has now been activated.

To deactivate this function, select "SURROUND OFF".

Note: Normally you can leave the MTS button set to "STEREO" and the Surround function set to "ON". Your TV will then automatically produce either Surround stereo or monaural, whatever is broadcast.

TO ADJUST SURROUND LEVEL

- 1 Press the DSP/SUR button on the Remote Control to call up the Surround ON/OFF mode on-screen display.
- 2 Press the + or - button while the Surround ON/OFF mode display is on the screen to call up the Surround adjustment mode display shown below.



Decrease ← → Increase

- 3 Press the + button to increase Surround level. Press the - button to decrease Surround level. Press and hold either button until your desired level is obtained.

ADJUSTING PICTURE

You may wish to adjust picture functions (CONTRAST, BRIGHTNESS, SHARPNESS, COLOR and TINT) to suit your personal preference.

- 1 Press the PIC button on the Remote Control or MENU button on the TV set to display the PICTURE menu shown below.

Repeatedly press the PIC button on the Remote Control or the ADV button on the TV set, then press the + or - button to adjust each picture function.

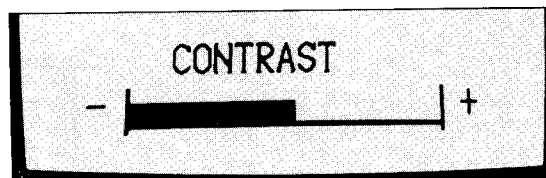


Notes:

- The PICTURE menu will automatically disappear from the screen if no control has been operated for about 15 seconds.
- The adjustment mode display will automatically disappear from the screen if no control has been operated for about 6 seconds.
- If you continue to adjust any picture functions, press the PIC button or the ADV button while the adjustment mode display remains on the screen. The next function will be selected. This is a quick step approach for total picture adjustments.
- The ADV button on the TV set will function only when any of the menu displays is on the screen.
- The PIP CONT function is explained on page 33.

TO ADJUST CONTRAST

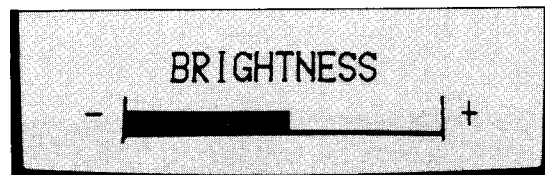
- 1 Press the PIC button or the ADV button until "CONTRAST" is displayed in magenta, then press the + or - button.



- 2 Press + to increase contrast. The magenta bar moves right.
Press - to decrease contrast. The magenta bar moves left.
Press and hold either button until your desired contrast is obtained.

TO ADJUST BRIGHTNESS

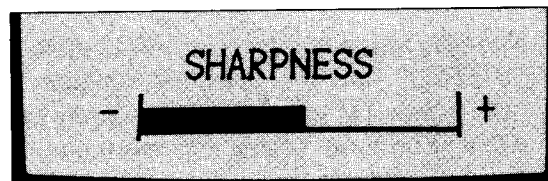
- 1 Press the PIC button or the ADV button until "BRIGHTNESS" is displayed in magenta, then press the + or - button.



- 2 Press + to increase brightness.
Press - to decrease brightness.
Press and hold either button until your desired brightness is obtained.

TO ADJUST SHARPNESS

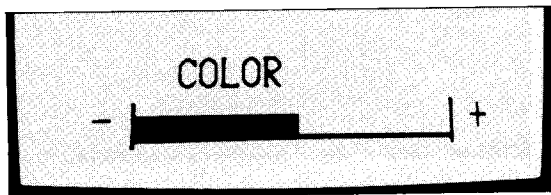

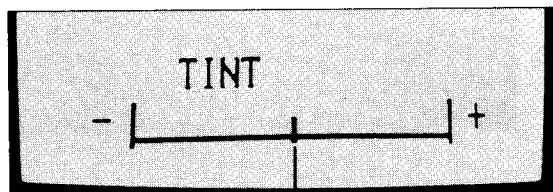

Press - to decrease color intensity.

TO ADJUST TINT

- 1 Press the PIC button or the ADV button until "TINT" is displayed in magenta, then press the + or - button.



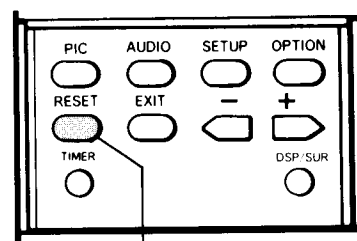
Reddish ← Cursor → Greenish

- 2 Press + to add green tint to the color tone.
Press - to add red tint to the color tone.
Press and hold either button until natural flesh tone is obtained.
The cursor will be indicated in yellow at the center setting.

RESET FUNCTION

You can restore all Picture and Audio functions to the factory-preset level by one push of the RESET button on the Remote Control as shown below.

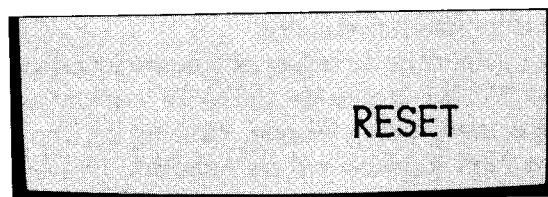

RESET button

Pressing the button will automatically set the CONTRAST to the maximum and all other functions (BRIGHTNESS, SHARPNESS, COLOR, TINT, BASS, TREBLE and BALANCE) at the center.

The word "RESET" will be displayed on the screen for a few seconds as shown below.



ADJUSTING AUDIO

You may wish to adjust audio functions (BASS, TREBLE, and BALANCE) to suit your personal preference.

- 1 Press the AUDIO button on the Remote Control or MENU button on the TV set to display the AUDIO menu shown below.

Repeatedly press the AUDIO button or the ADV button on the TV set, then press the + or - button to adjust each picture function.

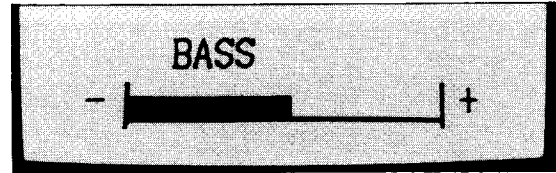


Notes:

- The AUDIO menu will automatically disappear from the screen if no control has been operated for about 15 seconds.
- The adjustment mode display will automatically disappear from the screen if no control has been operated for about 6 seconds.
- If you continue to adjust any audio functions, press the AUDIO button or the ADV button while the adjustment mode display remains on the screen. The next function will be selected. This is a quick step approach for total audio adjustments.
- To return the audio functions you have adjusted to the normal settings, press the RESET button on the Remote Control. See page 29.
- The ADV button on the TV set will function only when any of the menu displays is on the screen.
- The SPEAKERS function is explained on page 41.

TO ADJUST BASS

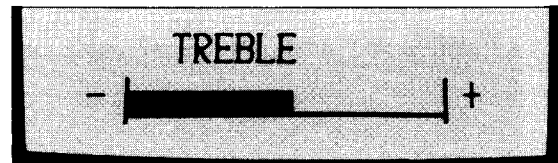
- 1 Press the AUDIO button or the ADV button until "BASS" is displayed in magenta, then press the + or - button.



- 2 Press + to increase bass.
Press - to decrease bass.
Press and hold either button until your desired bass level is obtained.

TO ADJUST TREBLE

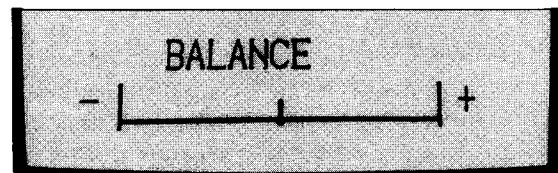

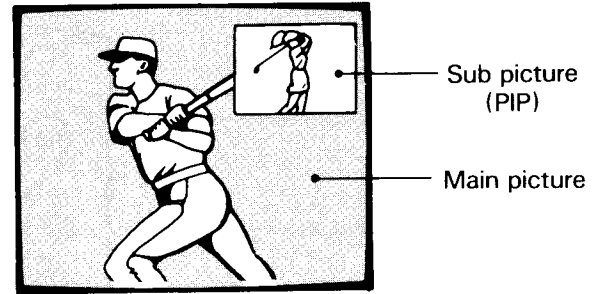

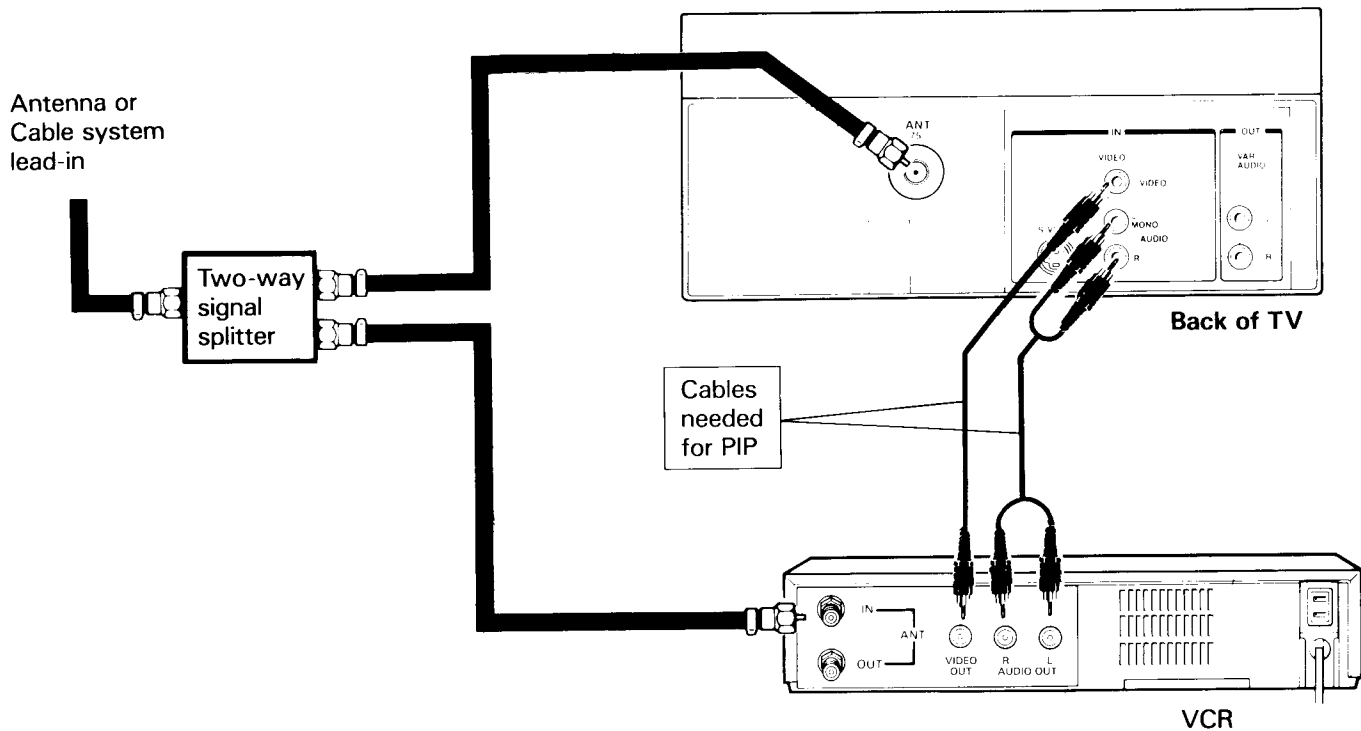

In addition to the main picture, another TV program or video source being received through the VIDEO input jacks can be displayed simultaneously as a sub picture. After you have connected another video source (such as a VCR) to your TV as shown below, you are ready to display the Picture in Picture (PIP).

Note: When using the PIP, the TV can display two pictures at once. However, one picture must be from an antenna input channel and the other must be from a VIDEO input channel.

OPERATION

Suppose you wish to watch the TV channel that the VCR is tuned to with PIP while the main picture shows one TV channel:

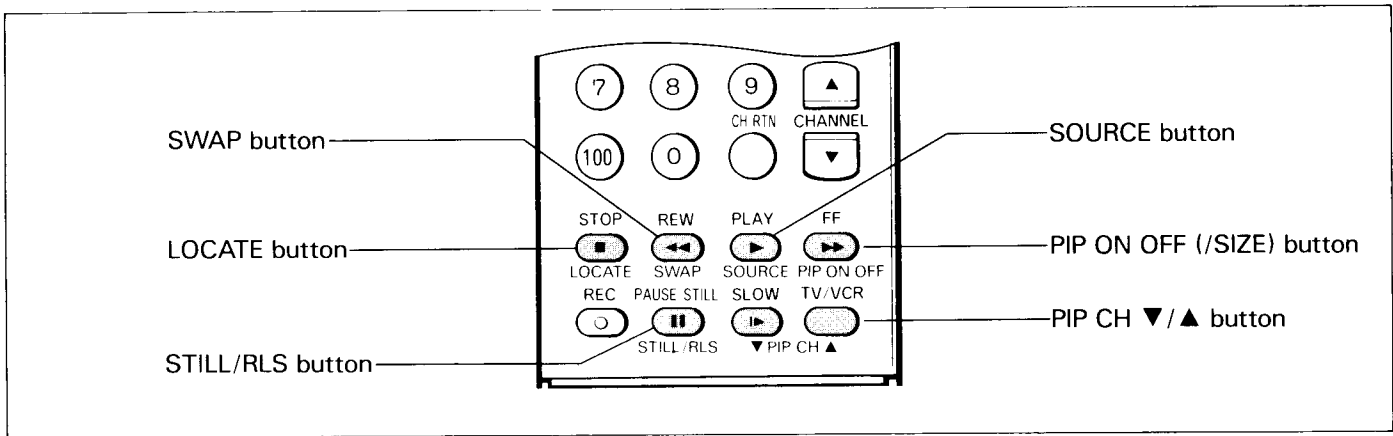
1. Turn the TV set on and select the TV channel you want to watch using the TV channel keys.

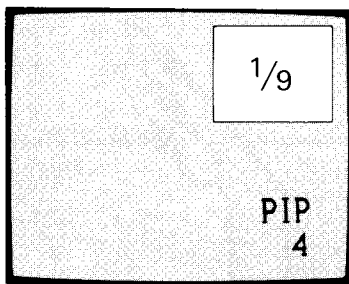

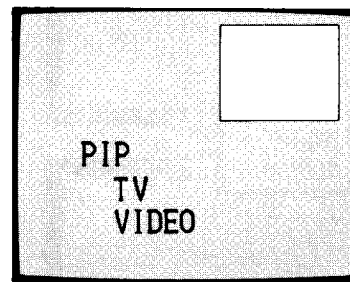

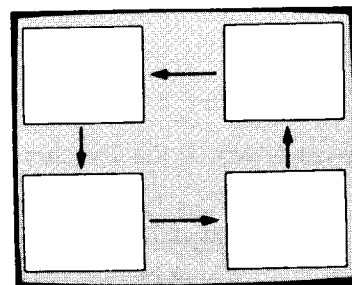

Note: If you cannot select any certain Cable channel, resetting the CABLE button may be necessary. Try to select another CABLE mode. See page 18.

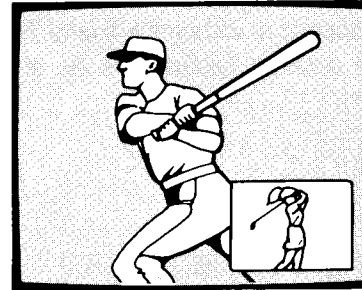
STILL/RLS (Release) BUTTON

Press the STILL/RLS button once while PIP is on the screen to freeze the PIP picture.

To return to an action picture, press the button again.

SWAP BUTTON

Press the SWAP button once to switch the PIP picture with the main picture.



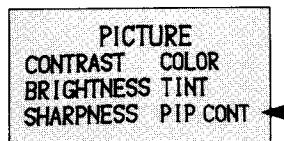

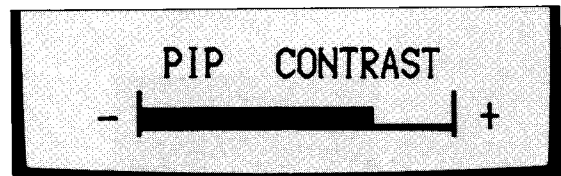

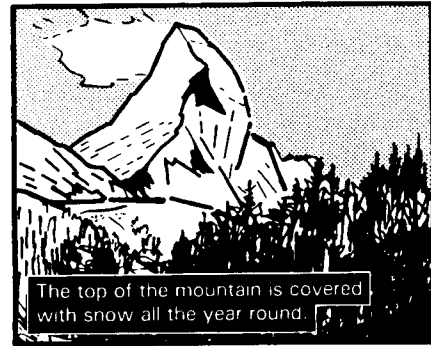
OPERATING CLOSED CAPTION FUNCTION

CAPTION

Closed captioning displays dialogue, narration, and/or sound effects of a TV program on the screen in a manner similar to subtitles in a movie.

Captioning is especially helpful for hearing impaired individuals.

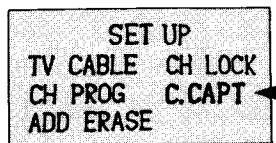
Captions will appear at either the top or bottom of the screen during caption broadcasts as shown at the right.



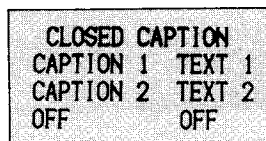
TO DISPLAY CAPTIONS

- 1 Check your local TV listings for the time and channel number of captioned programs. Programs captioned are usually notated by its service marks such as "CC".
- 2 Press the SETUP button on the Remote Control or the MENU button on the TV set to display the SET UP menu on the screen.

Repeatedly press the SETUP button on the Remote Control or the ADV button on the TV set until "C. CAPT" is displayed in magenta.



- 3 Press the + or - button to call up the closed caption select mode display shown below on the screen.



- 4 Press the + or - button until "CAPTION 1" or "CAPTION 2" is displayed in magenta. The CAPTION 2 mode may be utilized for alternate languages if they are being transmitted. The TV will display captions automatically if the program you are watching has been captioned.


If you don't want the caption displayed, select "OFF".

Note: The following situations may not be acceptable to decode the closed-captioned signal with this TV set.

- The video tape which was dubbed.
- The weak signal reception.
- The nonstandardized signal reception.

TEXT

Text is information that is displayed on the lower half of a TV screen. It is not related to the program on the TV screen. For example, it could be a listing of the closed-captioned programs, news, weather information or stock market reports.

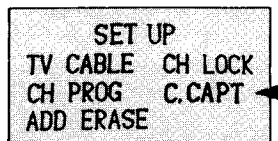

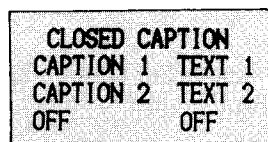
TO DISPLAY TEXT INFORMATION

- 1 Press the **SETUP** button on the Remote Control or the **MENU** button on the TV set to display the **SET UP** menu on the screen.

Repeatedly press the **SETUP** button on the Remote Control or the **ADV** button on the TV set until "**C. CAPT**" is displayed in magenta.



- 2 Press the **+** or **-** button to call up the closed caption select mode display shown below on the screen.



- 3 Press the **+** or **-** button until "**TEXT 1**" or "**TEXT 2**" is displayed in magenta.

The TV displays **TEXT** information automatically if the program you are watching has text added.

If you don't want to display the **TEXT** information, select "**OFF**".

Note: If you select a Caption format channel and the "**TEXT**" mode, the **TEXT** screen will always be displayed.

However, if the **TEXT** character signal is not transmitted, the characters are not displayed.

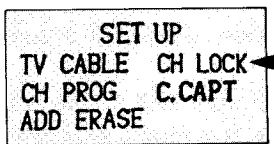
LOCKING CHANNELS FOR PARENTAL CONTROL

This feature allows you to program the TV so that any specific channel cannot be viewed without the use of the CHANNEL NUMBER buttons on the Remote Control.

TO LOCK OUT CHANNELS

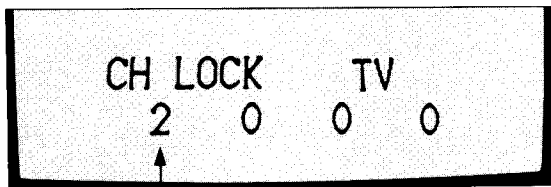
- 1 Select the channel you want to lock out.
- 2 Press the SETUP button on the Remote Control or the MENU button on the TV set to display the SET UP menu on the screen.

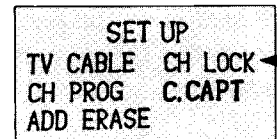

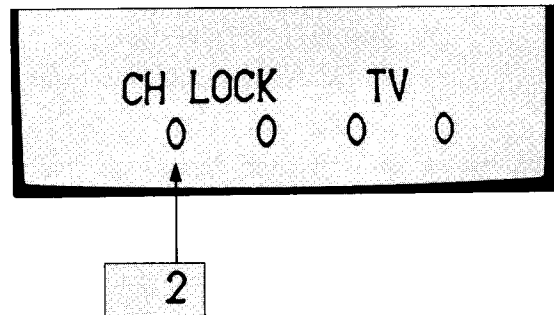

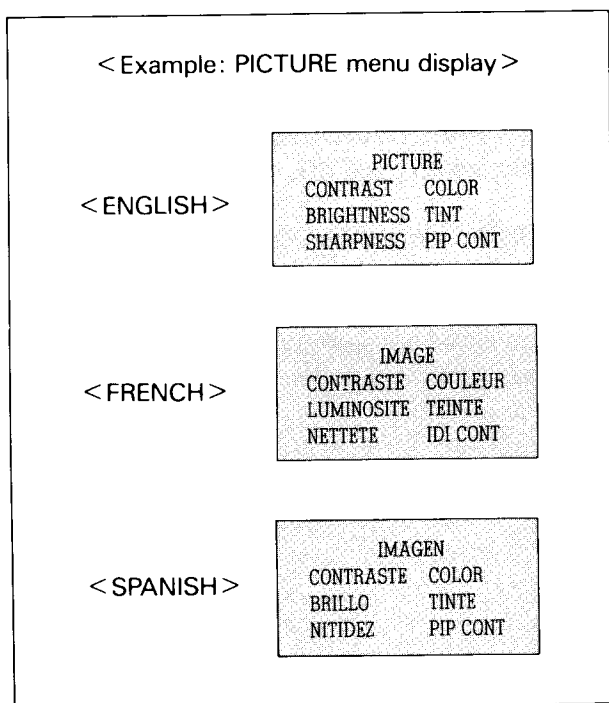

DEMONSTRATION FUNCTION

When this function is activated, your TV will automatically display a variety of its on-screen menus and special features. This function is provided for TOSHIBA dealer. You may not need to use this function.

- 1 Select the OPTION menu, and press the OPTION button or the ADV button until "DEMONSTRATION" is displayed in magenta, then press the + or - button once.

The on-screen display shown below will appear.

The words "DEMO START" should be in magenta.

The demonstration will start after about 6 seconds.

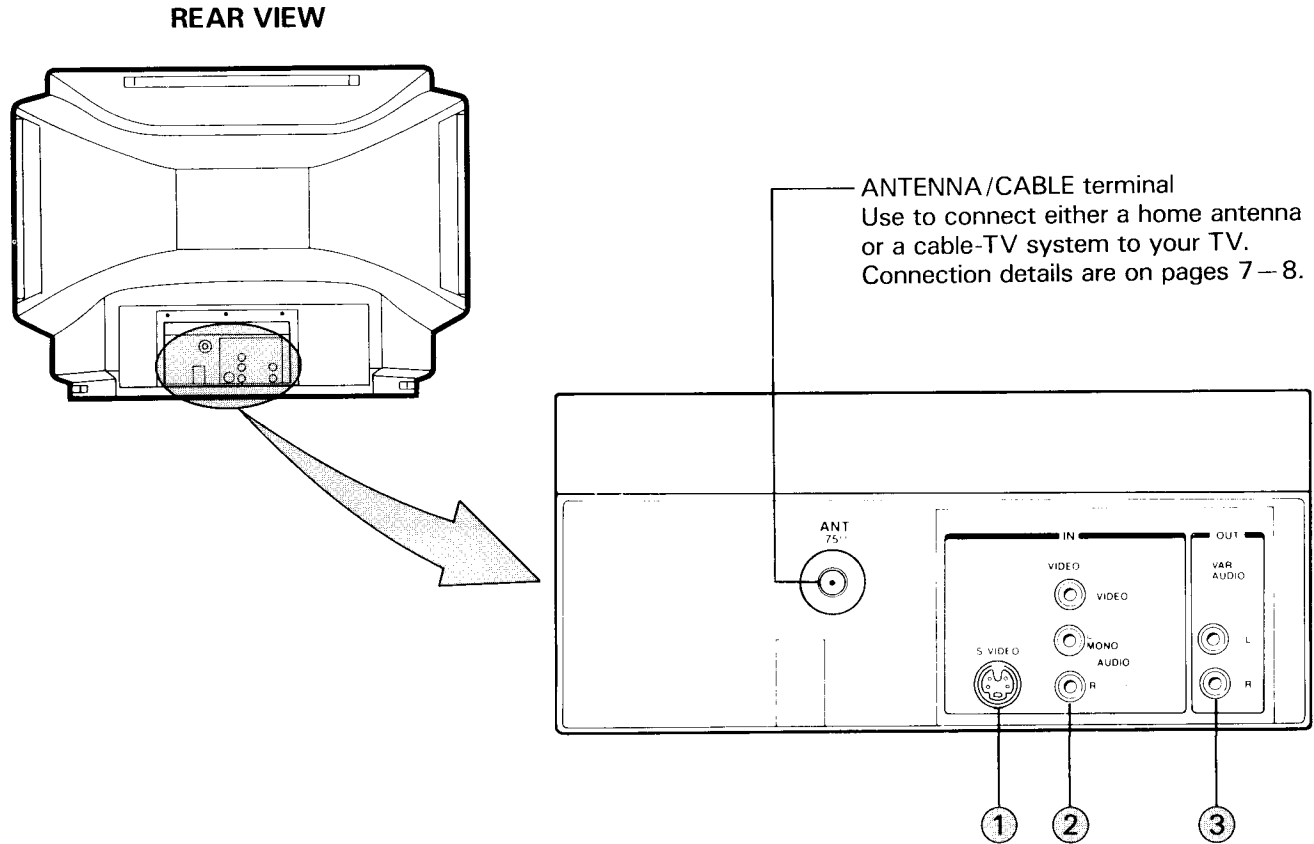


To stop the demonstration, select "DEMO STOP" mode.

MONITOR PANEL

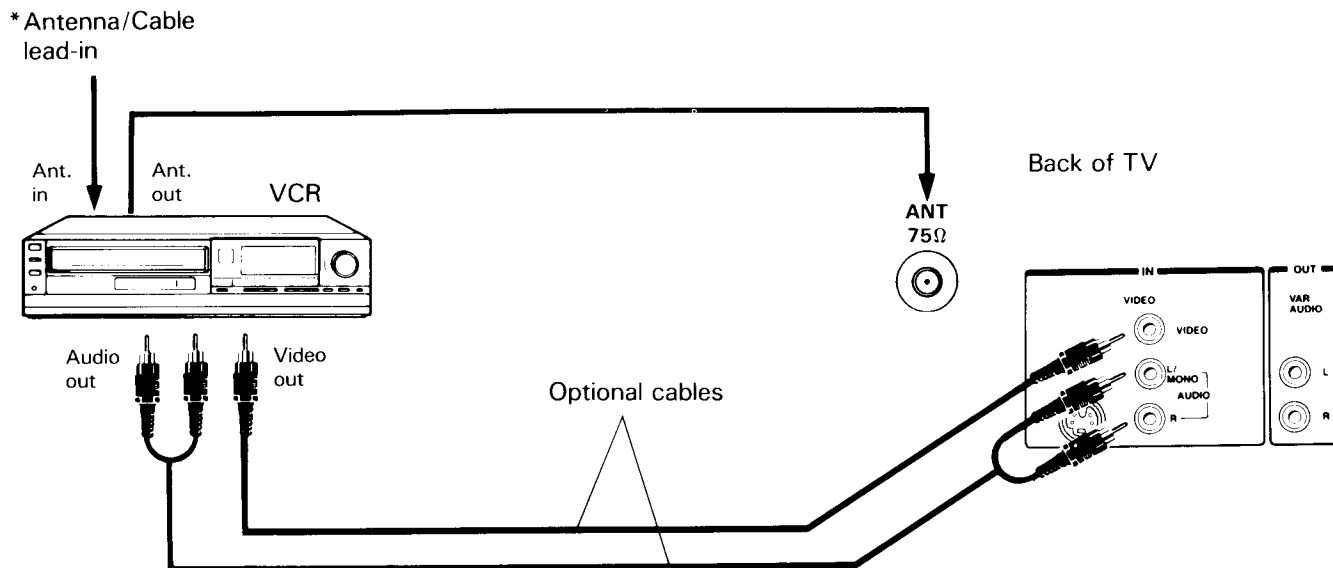
This TV set is equipped with S-VIDEO INPUT connector, VIDEO/AUDIO INPUT jacks, and VARIABLE AUDIO OUTPUT jacks for connecting your desired video/audio equipment.



- ① **S-VIDEO Connector**—provides for direct S-Video connection from S-VHS VCR. The TV's audio jacks can also be used to connect the VCR's audio cables. Connection details are on page 40.
- ② **VIDEO Jacks**—provide for direct connection of video devices (VCR, Video Disc Player, etc.) with video/audio inputs. Connection details are on page 39.
- ③ **VARIABLE AUDIO OUTPUT Jacks**—feed volume-controlled stereo audio out from whatever is displayed on the screen, allows connection of audio amplifier and lets you adjust sound level with TV's remote. Connection details are on page 41.

CONNECTING STANDARD VCR

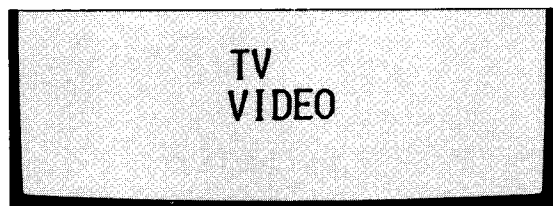
Connect the VIDEO jacks to the video and audio output jacks of a VCR, Video Disc Player, etc. for playback of video material. The material being played back on the video equipment can be viewed on the TV screen.



SELECTING VIDEO SOURCES

To operate your TV normally, refer to the instructions furnished with the video equipment.

- 1 Turn the TV set and VCR (or VDP) ON.
- 2 Press the TV/VIDEO button on the Remote Control or on the TV set to select the VIDEO mode; Each time you press the button, "TV" or "VIDEO" mode will alternate. The selected mode will be displayed in magenta.



Note: The TV/VIDEO button on the TV set will function as the ADV button while any of four menu displays (PICTURE, AUDIO, SET UP or OPTION) is on the screen.

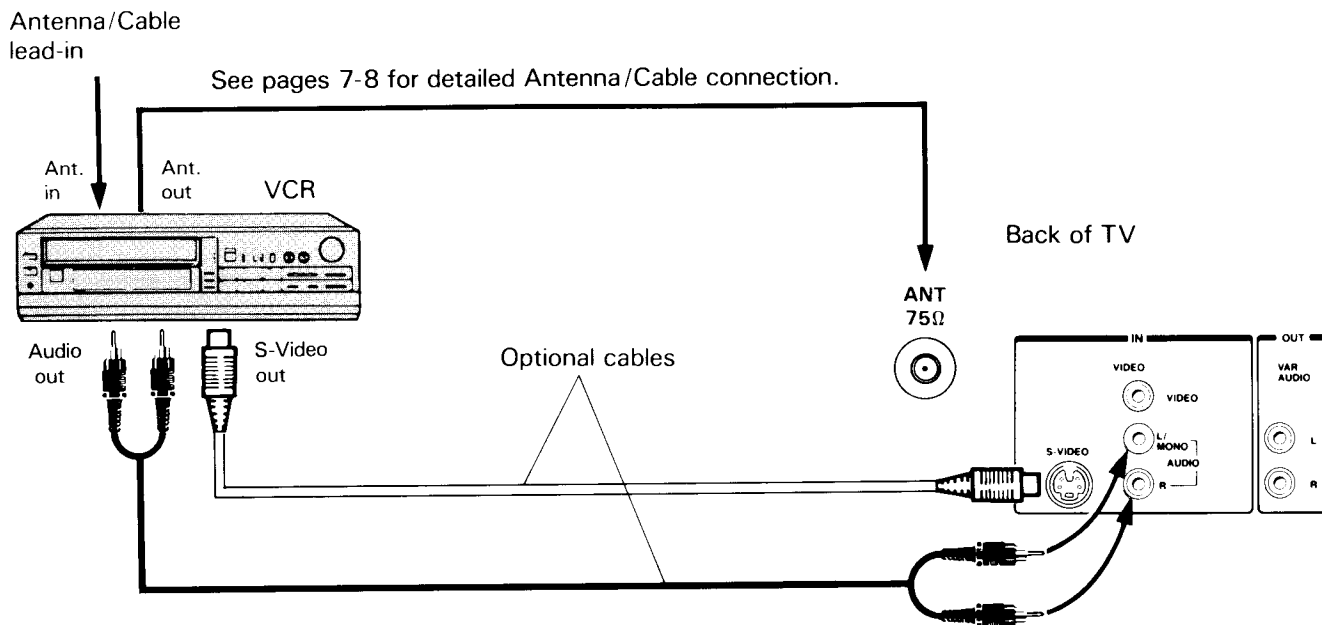
- 3 Operate your VCR (or VDP) normally.

Notes:

- When using monaural sound equipment, connect its AUDIO OUT to the L/MONO jack on the TV set.
- * If you use a 2-way signal splitter for antenna/cable connection, you can view either TV programs, or VCR tapes and not be concerned about the position of the VCR's TV/VCR switch. Connection details are on pages 7 and 8.

CONNECTING VCR WITH S-VIDEO CONNECTOR

If you connect a VCR with an S-VIDEO connector to the "S-VIDEO" connector on the back of the TV, you must also connect the audio, cables to the AUDIO jacks on the back of the TV. The S-Video cable supplies video signals only. Audio signals are separate.



SELECTING VIDEO SOURCES

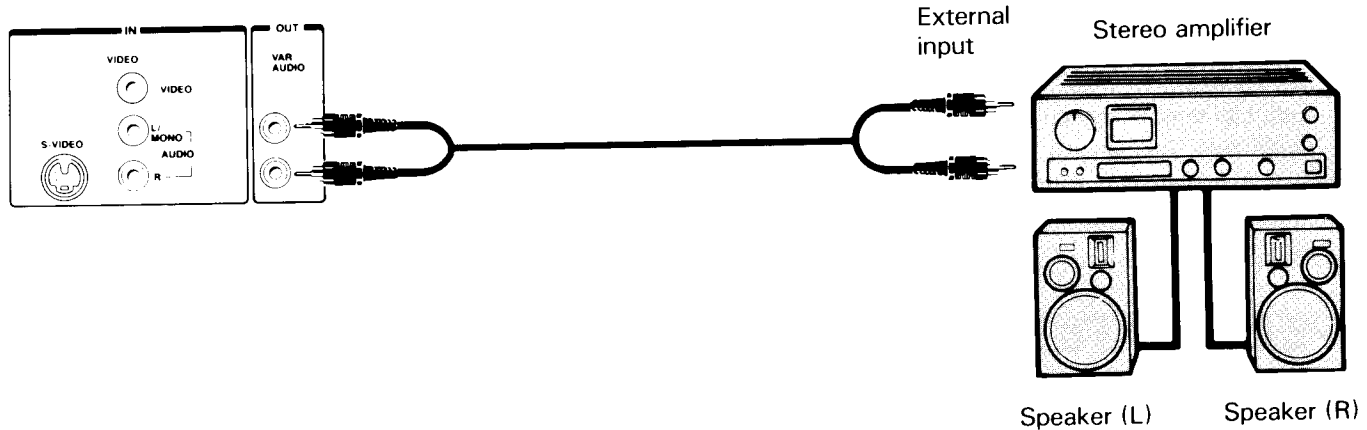
- 1 Turn the TV set and VCR ON.
- 2 Select the "VIDEO" mode by pressing the TV/VIDEO button on the Remote Control or on the TV set.
- 3 Operate your VCR normally.

Notes:

- Do not connect video equipment to both the "S-VIDEO" and "VIDEO" of VIDEO terminal at the same time.
- The S-VIDEO terminal accepts SEPARATED Luminance/Chrominance (Y-C) signals conforming to the NTSC standard.

CONNECTING AUDIO AMPLIFIER

Connect the VARIABLE AUDIO OUT jacks to the external input jacks on the stereo amplifier. You will be able to change and mute volume with the TV's remote control. You will also be able to control bass, treble and balance functions.



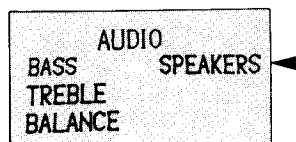
OPERATION

- 1 Turn the TV set and stereo amplifier ON.
- 2 Adjust the VOLUME control on the TV for a moderate listening level.
- 3 Disconnect the built-in speakers following the instructions below.
- 4 Adjust the volume control on the stereo amplifier for a moderate listening level.
- 5 Control of the audio can now be done using the audio function buttons (VOLUME, MUTE, BASS, TREBLE and BALANCE) on the TV's remote control.

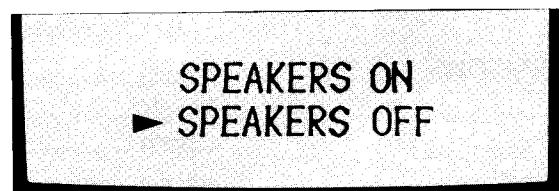
TO DISCONNECT THE BUILT-IN SPEAKERS

The built-in speakers have now been disconnected.

To resume the sound, select "SPEAKERS ON".

CLEANING AND CARE

WARNING: TV sets use High Voltage. Do not try to remove the cabinet back. Refer servicing to qualified service personnel.

■ To clean the TV screen:

1. First remove the plug from the power outlet to avoid possible shock hazard.
2. Use a clean cellulose sponge or chamois cloth dampened with a solution of mild detergent and warm water to clean TV screen and trim. Do not use too much water on the TV screen. Water spills into the cabinet may cause damage to the TV. Avoid excess water.
3. Remove any extra moisture with the same cloth or a dry one.

■ To maintain the finish and appearance of the cabinet, polish it from time to time with a quality furniture polish.

Note: Never use strong solvents such as thinner, benzene or other chemicals on or near cabinet, as they might damage the finish of the cabinet.
